PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome to the Annual Report of Templeton Cricket Club Inc. for season 1990/91. This document provides you with a summary of events both on and off the field last season, as well as the performances of each individual who represented the Club. A great deal of work has gone into compiling the Annual Report and I hope that it gives you a lot of enjoyable reading.

Season 1990/91 saw the Club experience some highs and lows. It is my perception that, as a Club, we have emerged relatively unscathed and are in a position to go onto a very bright and successful future. I will comment on some of our experiences as it is necessary for us to learn from our good work, as well as our mistakes.

A major concern to the Club in previous seasons was the lack of suitable practice facilities. With the endorsement of the Templeton Committee of Management and financial assistance from Knox Council and the Bayswater/Wantirna Ward Councillors, a project to upgrade and duplicate the practice wickets at Templeton Reserve was completed. These facilities are now the equal of, or better than, any other club in the R.D.C.A. My sincere thanks go to:

- * Norm Barnfield and Murray Parker who assisted me in liaising with Knox Council;

- * Bruce Macartney, Community Facilities Manager, City of Knox, for his assistance, patience and interest in our Club;

- * Staff of Knox Council and the contractors who worked on the project;

- * By no means least, the Bayswater/Wantirna Ward Councillors - Joan Schulz, Marie Wallace, Mary Radisich and later Ken McBride. Without their help and financial assistance, the project could not have proceeded.

The fundraising activities of the Club seemed to follow our fortunes on the playing field, a successful highlight being the Chocolate Drive in January/February. This raised over \$1,400.00 and ensured that the season wasn't a financial disaster. The efforts of Murray Parker in co-ordinating the Chocolate Drive deserve special mention. The result is a credit to ALL Club members and thank you for your support.

Sponsorship from local businesses did not necessarily come in the form of monetary donations, but rather the very practical donation of goods. A list of our sponsors and a special comment has been made elsewhere in the Annual Report, so all I will say is thank you. Some Club members were able to make monetary donations or supply some goods and these were gratefully accepted.

The Club is continually trying to improve its facilities, particularly the clubrooms. To this end, a mezzanine floor will shortly be installed in the Committee Room so as to allow for

storage of both Wantirna Football Club and Templeton Cricket Club equipment twelve months of the year. The enormous support from Ron Lovett in this regard is acknowledged. Our attention will turn to matters such as tables and chairs in the immediate future.

All junior sides represented the Club with honour and distinction during the season. Their performances were of such high standard that the Club won the Clive Fairbairn Shield as the R.D.C.A. Club Champion. Additionally, U14/3 won our fourth junior, and eighth Club, premiership and the Club was represented in Grand Finals at each age level. Four players won R.D.C.A. competition averages, with Stuart Elkins winning both batting and bowling awards in U14/3. Many players also participated in R.D.C.A. Representative matches. This is a fantastic result for the Club, particularly because some of the teams had less than eleven players for much of the season. The participation of parents and families also helped the boys during the season and is greatly appreciated by the Club. Thanks to Barry McClure, the Team Managers and other officials and helpers for your time and efforts.

Some of the negative aspects of last season need to be addressed. Probably the most obvious concern of the Club was the lack of support, particularly by senior players, for social functions. Those who attended enjoyed themselves, but the Committee struggled to find the right types of function to attract strong support. A concerted effort will need to be made to involve junior players and their families in Club activities also. These social functions are designed to assist in the Club's fundraising efforts. Accordingly, if the functions are not supported, annual subscriptions will inevitably rise.

The senior teams did not enjoy as much on-field success compared to previous seasons. The loss of 25 senior players at the start of the season did not help the cause, but some enthusiastic younger players joined the Club and many junior players willingly offered their services at senior level. The high number of changes forced upon the Selection Committee every match did little to develop team spirit or generate stability throughout all teams. An amazing statistic from the Annual Report is that 82 players represented the Club in five senior teams. A genuine commitment from all senior players to make themselves available for the season should ensure that teams are more settled and that an extra senior team can be fielded. Greater concentration at training to perfect our skills will see us take that vital catch or not throw away our wicket after doing the initial hard work.

The future of our Club will rely heavily on junior players progressing to our senior teams. In order to make this transition as easy as possible, senior players need to take a more active role in the training and development of juniors at all age groups. Much has been spoken on this topic, but the

Financially, the Club completed the year in a reasonable position, especially since the practice wickets were not budgeted for, but with the financial assistance of Ward Councillors, Templeton Cricket Club has training facilities that are comparable to any club in the R.D.C.A..

Many long hours have been taken at the Executive level, in an attempt to involve as many members as possible in Club responsibilities, without the extra burden of being an Executive Member. I hope we have found a solution to this problem. A decision on this subject will be made at our Annual General Meeting.

Several members of the present Committee have indicated that they will not be seeking a further term next season, this leaves opportunities for members who have a desire to ensure Templeton Cricket Club will continue for many years, to put their name forward for a Committee position.

Season 1991/92 puts Templeton Cricket Club Inc. at the crossroads, we still do not know if we will be graded in the "A" or "B" Competition, but whatever Grade we field senior teams in, a genuine effort by all concerned, parents, players and supporters is necessary to enable our Club to be progressive and successful.

My thanks to the members of the General Committee for their efforts during the past year, also to my family for their patience and support.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Attached for your approval is the Income and Expenditure Statement of Templeton Cricket Club Inc. as at 30 April 1991.

Our major project for the year was the practice wicket facilities which required a substantial amount of funds from the Club. Total costs of the nets was \$7,934.00 (with Knox Council paying an additional \$1,128.60 directly) of which the Club contributed \$2,360.00.

As a consequence, funds on hand at 30 April 1991 decreased by \$1,246.95 as compared to the end of last season.

The balance on hand at the end of the season was \$4,972.91. The Social Committee again have made a significant contribution with a transfer for the season to the Club account of \$5,500.00. In addition, I would like to acknowledge donations totalling \$255.00 from various families within the Club.

The coming season will again test our resources and we will rely upon all members to support the Club both socially and on the playing field.

PROPERTY STEWARD'S REPORT

The increased number of training nets has resulted in everyone receiving more time for batting and bowling. However, this has also meant that additional gear had to be made available. The introduction of the first training kit has saved both wear and tear to match gear along with reduced expenditure for equipment. COACH'S REPORT

Regrettably, season 1990/91 saw Templeton yet again struggle in its endeavours to become a successful A Grade club. This can be attributed to a number of reasons, principally being:

* The lack of quality seasoned players throughout the first four senior teams. Whilst it is perceived that the Club has many promising and talented junior players within its ranks, these players due to circumstances have generally been placed into positions which they cannot, nor can they be expected to, fulfill. That is to compete successfully week in week out against more seasoned competitors. This is not to say that in the long term that these junior players will not become solid performers, around which the Club can formulate more competitive performances.

* The low level of commitment to succeed by virtually all players. There would be very few players within the senior section of the Club who can honestly state that they fully committed themselves to both training and, to some extent, their Saturday performances. Whilst it is acknowledged that our training facilities could be classed as inadequate prior to Christmas, they are now considered to be the equal, or superior to, any other club within the R.D.C.A.. Far too often individuals were all too eager to profer excuses for non attendance at training or to make themselves unavailable for particular matches which in turn affected not only their own performances but the Club's performances overall.

It is my view that the Club is at the crossroads and needs to address some pertinent aspects urgently. It should be remembered by all that the "CLUB" is not a small group of people who hold official titles but every member who subscribes to the Club.

We all need to reappraise our commitment to make Templeton not only successful but totally unified where EVERY member seeks to put in effort of a tangible nature and not just making grandiose statements without effectively supporting these ideals in order for the Club to become successful both on and off the field. It is up to all members to ensure the Club's off-field success is achieved and make the Club more unified.

I have no doubt that if the Club is to become successful on the field in the short term, then we need to attract some quality seasoned players to our ranks and not see a continuation of our more seasoned players ceasing to have an active playing role.

The senior players at the Club have no doubt enjoyed their cricketing successes over many years and it is my tenet that we all now need to put something back into the game by ensuring that the vast wealth of junior talent possessed by Templeton is appropriately nurtured, thus ensuring future on-field success for the CLUB.

In closing, I thank Templeton Cricket Club for affording me the honour of being its coach for the past two seasons and, whilst not seeking reappointment to this position next season, I sincerely look forward to assisting with the development of its many talented youthful players.
