PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 1987/88 was an extremely difficult one that saw Templeton rise to the occasion at times and yet at other critical periods, not reach the heights we would have hoped. Every club member knew this would be a very challenging year. The step up in class was quite severe, so our on-field performances could be considered satisfactory.

Our First Eleven finished around the middle of the ladder in A1 and our other teams performed creditably in their respective grades. There is no doubt our performance on the field would have been significantly better if our application, dedication and enthusiasm had been even half of previous years.

The appointment of Michael Rupinic as Club Coach and First Eleven Captain and the success of last season, should have been the fillip the club needed to generate the necessary interest and enthusiasm. This season's executive should analyse why we failed, to ensure next season we regenerate excitement and variation into our social calendar.

Early in the season it became evident that we had not recruited as well as we should have. As a result a conscience decision was made to give every opportunity to the club's many talented youngsters. In hindsight this may have been taken to the extreme, however we did establish that some of these lads will play a major part in the future of Templeton.

The executive has always strived to give all club members, their families and friends a pleasant environment and surroundings to be proud of. Thanks to the magnificent co-operation from the Knox Council and the few members who assisted in ground maintenance and watering, our ground was by far the best in the R.D.C.A. We supplied (courtesy of Barry McClure and Ian Johnston) top quality carpet and towards the end of the season Ian Winnett and his band of very generous workers, remodelled the kitchen. To these people a very sincere thank you.

In an endeavour to compliment our facilities we organized team rosters to clean the rooms each Sunday. To the few who made the effort to assist, thank you. As President of Templeton I accept responsibility for the performance of the club and can only hope that the lessons learnt this season enable us to re-group and move in to 1988/89 with a more positive and united attitude. To my committee, thank you, although I believe because of the constituted structure, the workload is not as evenly shared as it should be. To the ladies who operated the canteen, thank you.

HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT

At the end of each season, one looks back and wonders whether the Club has been successful and what measures should be used to judge this. Is it games won by the senior teams, by the junior teams, or by both? Is it the amount of improvement by individuals? Or is it the ability of all Club members to participate in, and enjoy, all club activities?

Despite not enjoying the on field success of previous seasons, I consider that the Club continued to move in the right direction. It was obvious that the whole Club had taken a step up in class but this was done deliberately and the Executive committee's decision was proved to be correct. Five senior teams were playing in higher grades and every junior age group competed in division one. The second Under 12 team also moved to a competitive division and played in the Grand Final. The better standard of competition should ensure that all players are given the opportunity to perform to the best of their ability.

I must make special mention of our Junior Administrator and his group of Team Managers and helpers. I believe that Norm Barnfield was able to obtain terrific support from a great number of parents and this enabled our junior teams to play cricket in a most organised way. To all the parents who came along to watch and support the boys, I express the Committee's sincere appreciation. I have never been associated with any sporting organisation that has been able to enjoy such support, so please keep it up for the benefit of the boys. I also thank those senior players that helped out with the juniors.

All senior teams found the going harder but there were some encouraging signs. The Club was well served by the recruits in all grades and many junior players were given a taste of senior cricket. The outstanding individual performances with the bat came from Michael Owen (135, A1), Alan Bowes (138 & 109, D) and Robert Shakes (139, D), whilst with the ball, it was Michael Kupinic (7/64, A1) and Paul Denton (7/28, A3). Perhaps the most pleasing part of the season was the continued development of younger players, in particular Chance McPhee, Martin Wood, Stuart Lambrick, Robert Shakes, Wayne Peters and Gary Peters showing encouraging performances in the A1 team. These six players are the first of many that have a great opportunity to take Templeton Cricket Club from A Grade to Chandler Shield. Whilst the Executive Committee and the senior selectors are keen to promote youth, it

is up to the players to train hard and perform in matches to earn their reward.

Our Club has been based on a friendly family-orientated social atmosphere and the Executive Committee tried to continue this. I believe that the Social Committee did not receive the support of enough members and it was left to the all too familiar families to make the social functions a success. The fact that should be remembered is that member's subscriptions will inevitably have to rise if the Club cannot raise sufficient funds from other sources. I urge all members to make a special effort in this regard next season.

The Club was again fortunate to gain co-operation from the Templeton Reserve Committee of Management, Knox Council, and Wantirna High School in the provision of grounds. Thanks to the time and efforts of Murray Parker and the hard work of the Knox Council employees, Templeton Reserve was transformed from a sea of mud into a showpiece of the Ringwood and District Cricket Association. Special thanks go to the Council and the employees who worked on the ground. The support of the Committee of Management is also acknowledged. The most significant development was the construction of a pavilion at Milpera Reserve which will be used by the Club for the first time next season. Future Council projects include the completion of the kerb and channelling at Templeton Reserve and a watering program for Milpera Reserve. I hope that the good relationships that have been built up over recent years can be continued in the future. The Club is presently investigating the feasibility of practice wickets at Milpera Reserve.

I thank the members of the Executive Committee for their efforts over the season. For a relatively inexperienced Committee, I believe that overall a good job was done. If we learn from our mistakes and are prepared to listen to constructive criticism, the Club should continue to grow. One individual who deserves a special mention is David Snell whose efforts as Marketing Officer greatly assisted the Social Committee and brought new sponsors to the Club. I encourage all members to seriously consider assisting the Club at an Executive level if at all possible.

At our Senior Presentation Night, Mr. Bill Dean, President of the Ringwood and District Cricket Association, announced his intention to retire from the position. In recognition of his work for the R.D.C.A. and for his support of Templeton Cricket Club, the Executive presented him with an Honorary Membership. I take this

opportunity to personally thank Bill for his help and encouragement and wish he and his wife, Verna, all the best in their "retirement".

In a Club the size of ours, it is important to gain support from sponsors. As they have done in all previous seasons, Ward Spinks Real Estate Pty. Ltd. were generous sponsors in donating \$500.00. To all our sponsors, please accept the sincere appreciation of the Executive Committee and all Club members.

The role of Secretary again proved to be very busy and I thank those people who gave me assistance during the year. In particular, I thank my wife, Andrea, for her constant encouragement, assistance and understanding.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Dear Members,

Some people would say that Templeton Cricket Club has had a disappointing season, not having any senior sides participating in the finals series for the first year since our inception. I do not believe this to be the case. We have been very competitive in the A Grade competition and achieved our aim of consolidation in our first year. Our junior teams all performed very well taking into account the fact that they were all promoted to the first division in each age group. However, we as a club must not sit back and be satisfied having avoided relegation, we must now look to the finals series in the forthcoming season. This is not an impossible dream but more like a very obtainable target providing we all work together for the common goal.

Financially, the club is in an excellent position. Having cleared all accounts we will have a surplus in excess of \$2,000. This figure does not include any amount from the Social Committee as their accounts have not been finalised at the time of this report. As you can see from the balance sheet the cost of ground rental, umpires, equipment and R.D.C.A. charges amount to \$7,300 another \$2,250 is required each season just to keep the club running. That's a total of \$9,500 required just to break even. The total amount of senior and junior subscriptions this season was \$6,000 thus leaving a deficit of \$1,500. This is the amount required just to break even, never mind any surplus. As you can see your annual and weekly subs do not cover the cost of running the club.

Once again we have to thank the ladies of the club for their efforts in the canteen and with fundraising. To Andrea and her crew of hard workers, thank you sincerely on behalf of all members of the club. Just a reminder to all members please support your social committee while you have one that puts as much effort in to the club as ours. Remember, your subs do not even cover costs. Also this year the club is indebted to Mr. John Barbieri, Mr. Gordon Clarke, Coles Myer and Mr. or Mrs. Anonymous for their kind donations, all of which were greatly appreciated.

Finally, I would like to congratulate all trophy winners and thank my wife and family for their support not only this year but also the preceding years.

It now gives me great pleasure to present for your approval, the Templeton Cricket Club Incorporated, Fifth Annual Financial Statement and Balance Sheet for Season 1987/88.

Chris Harper and myself attempted to pull the game out of the fire taking the score to 9/146 before Chris unfortunately got caught. Another 13 runs were added before I lost my wicket (lack of concentration) leaving us 22 runs short and another loss. This game, more than any other is one we should have won.

Round twelve was a total disaster not because we were annihilated but the fact that some players did not even both to turn up and one just plain refusing to play in the Third Eleven. We eventually arrived at Wonga Park approximately two minutes before play was due to start with eight players and three juniors who we managed to grab at the last minute. Wonga Park who finished the day at 7/483 batted superbly and would definitely be my tip for the A3 Grade premiership.

In conclusion I would like to thank Geoff Ofield, who once again was my vice-captain, for a job well done. I would like to congratulate all trophy winners on their performances throughout the season and urge all players to get behind the club and assist us along the road ahead through A Grade and into Chandler Shield.

D GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The season was relatively successful for the Fourth's and should give much encouragement to the club members for the future. Winning 7 out of 12 with only 4 losses, the team finished 5th with over 100 points for the season.

Thirty-two players represented the club at this level and it was not until after Christmas that some sort of stability came into the batting; as was the pattern through other teams in the club. The bowling was strong enough to keep the opposition restricted to under 200 runs except on two occasions.

We lost the first two games due to poor batting, won the next two two-dayers with some solid batting including a record 417 total. We then slipped up badly against Glen Park by failing to make 100 in a one-day game with what was our strongest batting line-up to date. We just won the next one-day against Dayswater Park in a low scoring game and then beat one of the top sides thanks to a fine century by Robert Shakes. We won the first one-dayer after Christmas and were in a commanding position in the next game where rain washed out a result. By this stage Matthew Snell had established himself as a reliable opener and Alan Bowes and Glen Leonard were making runs in the middle order.

Another batting failure against Scoresby in a return fixture saw us out of the top four and in spite of two strong wins in the last two games we were out of the finals by a full game. At the end we had a very settled batting order and all the recognised batsmen were learning not to give their wickets away cheaply. Unfortunately the middle and lower order batsmen rarely revived the teams fortunes except in the Narrandyte game where the batting order had been changed around so as there were recognised batsmen for the second Saturday.

The bowling was always strong enough and nearly too good, as at times Jamie Mullen and Mark Morrison had the batsmen playing and missing at them and were much quicker than any other opening attack in the competition. They were well supported by a host of medium-fast bowlers such as Tim Horton, Tim Luttick, Michael Levi, Glen Leonard and Mark Bennett and early on in the season we had the services of Brett Keys and John Nightingale. We were able to call on a variety of spinners headed by Pat Leehan with Alan Bowes the find of the season. Brad Crowley bowled intelligently when required; some gentle left arm spin was also available on occasions. Alan Bowes had a wonderful season with the bat and Matthew Snell (U/16) developed into a steady unflappable opening batsman, finally being partnered by Brad McAndrew who provided the necessary momentum of runs at the start of the innings. Michael Levi and Glen Leonard settled down at 10's 3 & 5 respectively and both played some valuable innings, Glen being able to push the score along when it was needed. Unfortunately, we fell away from there on and several senior players (myself included) had an indifferent season. Brendan Ferris (U/16) made his mark on several occasions in the lower

half and showed his team mates how to concentrate and wait for the right ball to hit.

The wicket keeping was mainly in the hands of David Lavoie who found his touch with the gloves from mid-season onwards. We were also served well behind the stumps by Jason Denton, Dean Shaw and for one game as David's stand-in, Brad McAndrew. The general standard of fielding and catching was good and once players had become used to regular fielding positions, the standard progressed to a very high level in the last few games, including some spectacular run outs.

Many of this team played in higher grades during the season, some returned back down. This was not because of their cricketing abilities letting them down but their attitude and self-discipline. It is easy for these players to do well in D, E and F Grades, but their goal and challenge must be to play in A 1 and 2 and ultimately in Chandler Shield. The determination as a batsman must be "not to give your wicket away" and as a bowler "to keep attacking the batsman and make him play a false shot".

Nearly all the team should be playing in a higher grade next year including the U/16 boys. This will only come about with practice and your own desire to play up to your capabilities. We expect you to play to your known potential but with the experiences gained at higher levels your skills and ability will increase beyond this. This all starts at training - both pre-season and each Tuesday and Thursday night during the season.

Finally it was a pleasure to captain such a team of promising cricketers and many thanks to my deputy, David Lavoie and vice-captain, Pat Leehan, for their support and advice on and off the field. To all players, you played the game in the right spirit and won by being better cricketers as a team on the day.
