# PRESIDENT'S/SECRETARY'S REPORT

Templeton Cricket Club Inc. really came alive in the second half of season 1988/89, culminating in three fantastic premierships. Our 4th XI, Under 14-2's and U12-1's played superbly, displayed wonderful sportsmanship and treated their respective opposition to some "champagne" cricket. To all the players and those associated with the teams, congratulations for a magnificent achievement - all of Templeton is very proud of you.

Approaching the season, the Committee made a conscience decision to install drainage at Templeton Reserve. The Knox Council offered funds to supply a quantity of pipes, sand, etc., however we had to supply the labour. Occasionally, it is advantageous to suffer in the short term to reap the long term rewards. In this instance we certainly suffered, however, I am absolutely sure that the work we did will go a long way to significantly improving the playing surface in future years. Unfortunately, we couldn't play on the oval until after Christmas, which did tend to disrupt us on the field and socially.

At the seasons end, the ground was a picture, hopefully we will get full use next year.

There is no doubt, we as a single club, could not have installed the drains ourselves. This working bee really saw the Football and Cricket Clubs unite as one body and complete the task together. For the first time in my memory there is a terrific relationship between the two clubs, which is exactly how it should be. To all the kind-hearted members of both clubs, thanks a million.

As the season developed, it became obvious we were going to struggle off the field more so than on. Through many factors, we fell down socially, the main reason probably the non-use of Templeton and the widely fluctuating age gap of our Club. There is no "mid-range" age group, we have an extremely young Club, people at an age where many different activities are available which means that a majority of members are consistently unavailable for cricket club functions.

Under the leadership of Peter Rogers, the 1st XI finished fifth in A1, a marvellous performance, considering all the disruptions we had during the season.

Peter's role this year was a very difficult one. Firstly, the ground being out of use, many senior players consistently unavailable and the majority of senior members (1st XI aspirants) rarely at practice. Who knows what our 1st XI could have achieved with a little more dedication and thought.

The remainder of the Senior XI's struggled (except for the 4th's), however, quite a few juniors were "blooded" which should benefit Templeton in future years.

Junior teams had a great year, winning two premierships, one third place and two teams just outside the four.

Overall, Templeton had a fairly successful year on the field, but a very poor season otherwise. As mentioned earlier, there were reasons. However, I believe there are too many members who are prepared to leave all the work to everyone else. The Sunday cleaning rosters for the 1st through to 5th elevens were poorly attended. I am pleased to say the sixth's all pitched in.

With the exception of the drainage, the working bees were bordering on a disgrace, even though the last working bee was notified by letter.

Socially, I must admit, was very disappointing, and it was left to all the familiar families to support the Club. One encouraging aspect was the appearance at two functions of a number of junior parents.

From an executive committee viewpoint, this season was a very traumatic one. During the year we had in excess of \$700 stolen, which was never recovered. This put us on the back foot financially and resulted in a very ordinary year from a social and financial viewpoint.

Sadly, we lost our Secretary, Paul Owen, and Treasurer, Paul Denton, during the season. Both gentlemen have worked very hard since the Club started and to lose their combined experience was a severe blow.

I would like to personally thank both Paul Owen and Paul Denton for their one hundred per cent contribution to me as President, but more so to the development and growth of Templeton Cricket Club.

Brett Keys also resigned towards the end of the season and was replaced with Glen Leonard.

I would be remiss if I did not pass on a special thank you to Rosemary McClure, Terry Elverd, Marie Walker and Gwen Lavoie for their consistent support in the canteen throughout the season and during the finals. Also to Rob Sharpe who continually offered his services to assist in many areas during the year.

To the Executive, thank you for your efforts during the year.

### A2 GRADE - CAPTAIN'S REPORT

On a results only basis the 2nd's had an ordinary 88/89 season. However results are not necessarily the main criteria in measuring success for 2nd or 3rd X1 year. In my view 2nd or 3rd X1's are about giving younger players an opportunity to improve their game and progress towards the 1st X1.

From this viewpoint I believe that the 2nd X1 had more success. Glen Leonard is clearly the most improved cricketer in the club with his 23 wickets and a 150 runs for the season indicating he is true all rounder. Jason Denton and prior to injury Jamie Mullen also showed that in future seasons with a little improvement and hard work at practice all three players will be regular 1st X1 players.

Other younger players who contributed during the season and displayed promise were Adrian Watson and Tony Brambilla

However for all players to succeed, whether they be young or experiences I believe they must:-

(i) practice regularly

(ii) learn to "tough out" the hard times; and

(iii) concentrate at all times whilst on the field.

At times, during the season, the 2nd X1 suffered on the field due, I believe to the above factors.

Finally I would like to thank all players who played for 2nd X1 during the season as they all gave 110% effort and vice vice captains for their valuable advice during the season.

I am confident that season 1989/90 will see the younger players of this season further progress and push the 1st X1 and 2nd X1 to the finals.
