TREASURERS REPORT SEASON 1999/2000

The goal for the Templeton Cricket Club in season 1999/2000 was to build a bar for the members and to continue on from last season's excellent year and achieve a surplus of \$5000.

Yes we have built a bar and it looks fantastic but unfortunately financially the Club did very poorly. We recorded a deficit of \$1167 - for the season which is a \$6106 turnaround from the previous season.

There were a number of reasons why this loss occurred and the major reasons were

- 1) Due to lax security and the trust of a friend and member of the Club, funds between \$800 - \$1000 were stolen from one Saturday night's takings. These funds have not been recovered as yet.
- 2) Sponsorship wasn't obtained as easily as previous years and was down by \$3900.
- 3) Due to a number of 21st Birthday parties during the season, bar takings and raffle income were down by approx \$1500-.

I would like to thank Brett Gibb and Jason Disney for another highly successful Superdraw Function, which was enjoyed by everybody that attended.

INCOME

SUBSCRIPTIONS

(Refer Annexure ' A')

CANTEEN

The canteen was operated by paid employees each Saturday until 3.30pm and 5.30pm when the firsts played at home. The canteen made a profit of \$273-19 for the season which included a wages bill of \$ 1040-.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

This is the money received from players as payment for club merchandise. This amount is lower than expenses as in most instances the club is still subsidising the cost of the clothing. We still have a large amount of stock on hand.

SPONSORS/DONATIONS

Extremely disappointing season with no cash sponsorships received, down \$3900- from last season. A new strategy is being looked at to resurrect our much needed sponsorship funds.

SOCIAL FUNDRAISING

From a financial perspective this season was successful in the area of social/fundraising. The social levy worked well with approximately 75% of players using their free admittance to most social functions.

We promoted one social function as a fundraiser, which was our Superdraw Raffle, organised by Brett Gibb and Jason Disney. This was again a highly successful function enjoyed by everybody who attended and making a profit of \$5000- for the club. The spinning wheel and other raffles raised funds for the club but ^{was} down on previous years due to the lack of numbers on Thursdays and Saturdays.

OTHER INCOME

This consists of other/ unusual income.

Income of \$2290- was from the players for their trip away.

Income of \$725- was collected from the football club for costs in painting the rooms
And \$500- was received for the sale of the pool table.

EXPENSES

CRICKET BALLS

Expenditure was increased by \$876- from last season due to the increase in senior teams, more second innings games and increase in price.

BANK CHARGES

The credit card merchant facility accrued charges of \$465- from credit card spending of \$11297-. Credit card spending increased by \$3993- this season. Due to GST merchant charges on credit card purchases will increase by 10%. Therefore we will increase the credit card fee to \$2.75 next season. Government charges of \$147- were incurred for the season.

EQUIPMENT

The purchase / renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. This year our equipment expense was lower due to the purchase of discounted cricket gear last season.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

The club purchased a large number of items for members pre-GST this year. The club is holding \$1330 worth of stock for next season.

GROUND MAINTENANCE

This includes costs for the uncovering and covering of Templeton and Milpera ovals And the purchase and laying of instant turf at Templeton.

PRINTING / STATIONERY

Higher this season with the costs of printing the Annual Report and Superdraw raffle tickets.

RDCA

An increase in costs of \$600- was due to a number of reasons including computer costs of \$378- and fines of \$90- incurred during the year.

SOCIAL / FUNDRAISING

This includes payments for the functions during the year. DJ'S, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred trying to increase our income.

OTHER EXPENSES

Payments not included elsewhere. These expenses include the cricket trip away \$2,290, indoor cricket training \$401, costs incurred in building and fitting the bar \$3,010 and painting of the clubrooms \$1,450.

- (b) A Bowler must play in more than half the matches contested by his team and bowl not less than 400 balls.*

ALL ROUNDER

A player must play in more than half the matches contested by his team and score not less than 100 runs and bowl not less than 200 balls.

JUNIOR TROPHIES

- (1) A Batsman must play in more than half the matches contested in that grade and score runs as per the following table :-*
- (2) A bowler must play in more than half the matches contested in that grade and bowl in that grade at least the number of ball as per the following table :-*

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

The Senior Club Champion will be a player from the Clubs first eleven who has achieved the most accumulated points during the season.

The Junior Club Champion will be the player who has achieved the most points during the season.

UNDER 14/1 TEAM MANAGERS REPORT

PRE CHRISTMAS

After the first six rounds we had won four (4) games, lost one (1) and drawn one (1) with the drawn game being disappointing as we were in an unbeatable position and got rained out. For the first few games we tried a number of boys to get a competitive and settled side. I tried to have a regular batting and bowling order and then rotating the rest so each boy got a fair go. This seemed to work quite well. The side was very even in the bowling and in the batting we had a good top order. Out of all the games we were only bowled out twice.

AFTER CHRISTMAS

Having won our last three games before Christmas, the boys were feeling very confident and we ended up winning the next three games quite easily (scoring over 200 runs twice) which put us into the finals. By winning our last game we finished second giving us a home final.

It was our batting that was outstanding in particular Chris Knights and Nathan Owen who were regularly getting 50's and retiring. This set up a number of wins. You still have to stop the opposition from achieving the runs, so at training we concentrated on fielding, catching and bowling on a good line just outside off stump.

When you work on something like this it gives you great satisfaction to see the results on the field, and this was happening. Our fielding improved immensely and quite often a run out would occur, by the pressure that was being exerted.

SEMI FINAL

We had to play Mooroolbark who was the only side that had beaten us.

They won the toss and put us into bat. We scored about 145 with good batting efforts from Jamie Baker and Jason Thatcher. It wasn't our best batting performance but we had the runs on the board.

They got off to a bad start with a run out in the second over (again good fielding), but steadied and were cruising, but just before drinks we took three quick wickets which put us back into the game. From there on we bowled and fielded very well with wickets falling consistently and eventually bowled them out for 124 putting us into the **grand final**.
