On the field season 97/98 was probably close to Templeton Cricket Clubs finest hour. However, off the field it was not as "big" as it could have been.

This is not the appropriate forum for me to go on about the various downfalls of the season suffice to say that there is nothing that cannot be remedied with continued hard work.

I will though mention a few general points.

The committee decided this year we would not be as "strict" in our financial policies for the season. We decided that we would take peoples' word for things and not a deposit as in the past. Unfortunately this led to the club running at a significant loss for the season.

This was typified on Senior Presentation Night. As late as the day of the event people promised to attend and then did not. This contributed to an approximate \$1500 loss being made on the night as these people were paid for.

Another disappointing factor this year was the attitude of many members towards the decisions made by the committee. This included allegations of being "tight-arses", members still owing money for playing shirts they were given for Round One and the refusal of some members to sell raffle tickets. Never in the history of the club had the members received so much (ie training shirts & pre-season training costing \$2,200) with no increase in subscriptions.

A special mention should be made to the many sponsors/donations this season. Most notably Poste Haste P/L who injected a large sum of money into the club. Steve Johnston should also be recognised for his very generous donations of picture frames for the club photo's. Thanks Zippy !!

I would like to thank my friends on the committee for the tireless job they did over the past year and I hope to continue with them next year. Finally I would like to thank Jo and Hayley for the support they gave me all through the past year.

Notes Forming Part of the Financial Statement

Adjustments to Opening Cash Balance.

During the season things that were promised to the outgoing committee were not received therefore the actual opening balance for cash, in hindsight, was overstated last year. These adjustments were made to reflect the actual cash available at the start of this season.

INCOME

Subscriptions

Refer Annexure A.

Canteen

At the start of the year the operation of the canteen was leased to an external party. The fee for season 1997/98 was agreed at \$650.

Sponsors/Donations

During the year the club was very lucky to have many generous sponsors. Much of this sponsorship money was received as part of deals that were brokered in regard to playing shirts, jackets etc. Also included in this amount is a \$700 grant received from VicHealth for the provision of Junior Equipment.

Club Merchandise

This is money received from players as payment for club merchandise. This amount is much lower than the expense as it was decided to apply the sponsorship received against the cost to ensure low prices for the members. In most instances the club was still subsidising the cost of the clothing. This was mainly due to price rises that were incurred after the publication of prices.

Social/Fundraising.

From a financial perspective this season was a little disappointing in the areas of Social/Fundraising. The committee decided that this year we would be a bit more lenient in regard to collecting monies in advance for social events. Unfortunately people didn't support certain events when they had promised they would and as a result we made approximately \$1,600 for the season. We lost a total of approximately \$2,200 on two major events (one being \$1,500 on Senior Presentation Night). The funny part was that those who supported the club in this fashion had a great time. Other avenues for raising funds in this area will have to be looked at, possibly the implementation of a fundraising levy.

Other Income

This consisted of other/unusual income received. The bulk of this was money received for member purchases made at Crown Cellars on the club account and a refund from a coaching course for Duncan.

EXPENSES

Equipment

The purchase/renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense of running a cricket club. This year was no different to any other year and the kits were maintained at the same high level.

Social/Fundraising.

The old saying "You have to spend money to make money" is more than highlighted here. This includes payments for Presentation Night, DJ's, Butcher, chocolate suppliers, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred trying to raise a dollar.

Power/Gas

This is actually the 96/97 account however at the time of writing we had not received this years account.

Council

Professional plans were drawn up for the proposed new nets during season 96/97. It was decided that this would lend more weight to the clubs application for capital works. This represents the costs incurred to do this.

Trophies

The budgeted amount was exceeded in this case. I suppose this could be considered a cost of success. Included in this amount however is the cost of upgrading and renaming the clubs perpetual trophies along with the thank you gifts for our major sponsors.

Club Merchandise

The club incurred price rises to purchase the club merchandise after the publication of the selling prices to the members. As a result the cost in this area was exceeded. However, it was decided that this cost would not be passed onto the members. Ideally the committee planned to break even in this area once the sponsorships received were taken into account. Unfortunately this did not occur.

The club is holding \$1,745 worth of stock for next season.

Other Expenses

Payments not included elsewhere. These include Incorporation Fees, Liquor Licence, Insurance, Indoor Training, Member Alcohol Purchases, Postage, Milo Registrations, Property Stewards supplies and Jukeboxes/Entertainment.

Purchase of Assets

During the year assets were purchased for the enjoyment of the members. These include a pool table, mats, microwave oven, picture frames, dartboard. It is hoped these will be around for some time.

Outstanding Items

There is possibly one outstanding account at Boocock's Meats for approximately \$70.00.
