#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

SEASON 1992/93 GOT OFF TO AN EXTREMELY FRUSTRATING START, NOT ONLY ON THE FIELD BUT OFF. THE LATE WINTER RAINS NOT ONLY SAW A DELAYED START TO THE PLAYING SEASON BUT DELAYS IN HAVING OUR CENTRE WICKET REPLACED AT TEMPLETON, RULED THE GROUND UNFIT FOR PLAY PRIOR TO CHRISTMAS. THESE COMBINED REASONS PUT A STRAIN ON THE CLUBS FINANCES AT A TIME WHEN WE NEEDED TO BE CONSOLIDATING OUR FINANCIAL POSITION.

THE PAST SEASON WAS EXTREMELY DISAPPOINTING FROM A COMMITTEE PERSPECTIVE WITH A FEW OF THE EXECUTIVE MEMBERS NOT FULFILLING THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE CLUB AND ITS MEMBERS. I FEEL PEOPLE WHO TAKE UP THESE POSITIONS SHOULD BE PREPARED FOR THE WORKLOAD AND IF THEY ARE UNABLE TO COMMIT TO THE AMOUNT OF TIME REQUIRED THEY SHOULD NOT SEEK ELECTION AT OUR ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING. THERE IS MORE TO BEING ON THE COMMITTEE THAN ATTENDING ONE MEETING PER MONTH.

I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SAY "THANK YOU" FOR THE CONTINUED EFFORTS AROUND THE CLUB OF PEOPLE SUCH AS PAUL DENTON, NORM BARNFIELD, MURRAY PARKER ETC. IF THESE PEOPLE DECIDE TO TAKE A BREAK FROM THE CLUB WE COULD FIND OURSELVES STRUGGLING TO FIND PEOPLE TO MATCH THEM FOR EFFORT AND COMMITTMENT TO THE CLUB.

ON THE SOCIAL SIDE, WE HAD A REASONABLY GOOD YEAR WITH WHAT OPPORTUNITIES WE HAD. MOST OF THE FUNCTIONS WERE SUCCESSFUL AND WELL ATTENDED, WITH OUR PRESENTATION NIGHT BEING ANOTHER GREAT NIGHT FOR ALL WHO ATTENDED. I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO THANK NATHAN SMALL FOR HIS EFFORTS ON SATURDAY NIGHTS, COOKING A WIDE VARIETY OF MEALS.

SPONSORSHIP PLAYS A MAJOR ROLE IN CLUB SURVIVAL AND I WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL THOSE WHO DID SUPPORT OUR CLUB OVER THE PAST SEASON. IN PARTICULAR, PAUL ATTFIELD (TOPLINE SPORTS) FOR HIS GREAT SUPPORT. IT IS THE SUPPORT GIVEN TO OUR CLUB BY SPONSORS SUCH AS PAUL, WHO DESERVE THE RETURN PATRONAGE BY ALL CLUB MEMBERS WHENEVER POSSIBLE.

ON THE PLAYING FIELD WE HAD A FRUSTRATING START TO THE SEASON WITH OUR FIRST ELEVEN LOSING THREE OF THEIR FIRST FIVE GAMES BY A COMBINED TOTAL OF TWENTY RUNS. THIS RUN OF BAD LUCK WAS SOMEWHAT TURNED AROUND OVER CHRISTMAS WITH THE PERSISTANCE OF SCOTT AND DAVE SIMMONDS PAYING DIVIDENS. EVEN UP TO THE LAST FEW GAMES WE STILL HAD AN OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE THE FINALS.

WE HAD MODERATE SUCCESS THROUGH THE SENIOR RANKS WITH THE FOURTH AND FIFTH ELEVEN'S MAKING THE GRAND FINALS, BUT UNFORTUNATELY THEY WERE UNABLE TO GO THE FINAL STEP, AND BOTH TEAMS WENT DOWN IN TOUGH HARD FOUGHT GAMES.

OUR PERSISTANT EFFORTS AT CLUB LEVEL AND THOSE OF PAT MEEHAN AT TEMPLETON COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT LEVEL HAVE FINALLY PAID OFF, WITH THE INSTALLATION OF THE REMAINING SECTION OF KERB AND CHANNELLING. THE CONSTANT EFFORT TO UPGRADE THE GROUND, DRAINAGE AND TRAINING FACILITIES WILL CONTINUE OVER THE WINTER MONTHS IF WE ARE ABLE TO RECEIVE THE SUPPORT AND BACKING OF KNOX COUNCIL.

TO ALL WHO SUPPORTED AND PLAYED FOR TEMPLETON OVER THE PAST SEASON I SAY THANK YOU, AND I LOOK FORWARD TO SEEING YOU AROUND THE CLUB NEXT SEASON.

#### GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

IT GIVES ME GREAT PLEASURE TO PRESENT THE TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR SEASON 1992/93, AT THIS OUR TENTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

WE FIELDED A VETERANS ELEVEN THIS SEASON, AND GOING BY THE ENTHUSIASM FROM ALL CONCERNED AND CONSIDERING OUR SUCCESS ON THE PLAYING FIELD, IT LOOKS AS THOUGH THE CLUB WILL BE ABLE TO ENCOURAGE MANY "EXPERIENCED" PLAYERS OUT OF RETIREMENT AND BACK INTO CRICKET FOR A FEW MORE SEASONS.

WE WERE REPRESENTED IN THE SENIOR GRAND FINALS BY OUR FOURTH & FIFTH ELEVEN TEAMS, AND ALTHOUGH BOTH TEAMS FOUGHT HARD THEY WENT DOWN TO BETTER SIDES ON THE DAY.

FINANCIALLY, THE CLUB COMPLETED THE SEASON IN A REASONABLE POSITION CONSIDERING THE ABYSMAL WEATHER CONDITIONS THROUGHOUT THE FIRST HALF OF THE FIXTURE AND ADDING INSULT TO INJURY WE WERE UNABLE TO USE TEMPLETON RESERVE FOR COMPETITION UNTIL AFTER XMAS.

MANY LONG HOURS HAVE BEEN SPENT AT EXECUTIVE LEVEL EXPLORING WAYS TO INVOLVE CLUB MEMBERS IN THE DECISION MAKING PROCESSES ESPECIALLY THE DIFFICULT DAY TO DAY RESPONSIBILITIES THAT THE CLUB MUST PERFORM DURING THE CRICKET SEASON. WITHOUT THIS ONGOING COMMITMENT THE CLUB WILL STRUGGLE TO EXIST.

SEVERAL LONG SERVING COMMITTEE MEMBERS HAVE INDICATED THEIR DESIRE TO RETIRE FROM EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES AT THE A.G.M. WE MUST BE SUCCESSFUL IN FINDING COMMITTED REPLACEMENTS OR THOSE LEFT TO CARRY ON WILL STRUGGLE WITH EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES.

PAST AND PRESENT MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE OF TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB INCLUDING MANY PAST AND PRESENT PLAYERS, ARE PLEASED AND PROUD OF THEIR HARD EARNED REPUTATION WITH THE R.D.C.A. AND THE CITY OF KNOX AS A WELL ORGANISED UNIT WHO COULD ALWAYS BE COUNTED ON TO "DO THE RIGHT THING".

SEVERAL SITUATIONS DEVELOPED THIS SEASON BOTH ON AND OFF THE PLAYING FIELD WHICH DID NOT ENHANCE OUR REPUTATION IN THIS REGARD, PLAYERS WERE SUSPENDED BY THE CLUB FOR VARIOUS MISDEMEANOURS, AND TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB PAID UNNECESSARY (AND AVOIDABLE) FINES TO THE R.D.C.A. INCLUDING THE LOSS OF MATCH POINTS FOR NOT FOLLOWING THROUGH ON BASIC AFTER MATCH REQUIREMENTS.

WE MUST "GET OUR ACT TOGETHER" FROM THE EXECUTIVE LEVEL, ON THE TRAINING TRACK AND DURING COMPETITION, OR BE A CLUB THAT STRUGGLES FROM YEAR TO YEAR, IT'S UP TO ALL OF US TO ENSURE THE TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB GROWS NOT EXISTS, SO LETS DO IT!

MY THANKS TO THE MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE FOR THEIR EFFORTS DURING THE PAST YEAR, ALSO TO MY FAMILY FOR THEIR PATIENCE AND SUPPORT,

#### REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT.

AROUND AUGUST LAST YEAR IT WOULD HAVE BEEN DIFFICULT TO PENCIL IN MORE THAN 36 PLAYERS FOR THE TOP FOUR COMPETITION TEAMS. MANY OF THE YOUNGER MEMBERS BEING STILL HEAVILY INVOLVED WITH FOOTBALL HAD NOT BEEN SIGHTED OR HEARD FROM. BUT NUMBERS WERE COMFORTABLE UNTIL EARLY JANUARY WHEN ONE SELECTION NIGHT IT WAS FOUND WE WERE NEARLY A FULL TEAM SHORT AND FEW JUNIORS TO FILL IN.

WITH THE SHOCKING SPRING WEATHER JUNIOR MEMBERS FELL OFF OR DID NOT MATERIALIZE AND THE SECOND UNDER 14 TEAM HAD TO BE ABANDONED WITHOUT PLAYING A GAME. UNDER 16 NUMBERS WERE VERY DISAPPOINTING, A FEW PLAYERS MOVED TO OTHER CLUBS AND THE TEAM RARELY HAD 11 PLAYERS; INDICITATIONS ARE THAT WE MAY NOT HAVE THE NUMBERS TO FIELD AN UNDER 16 SIDE NEXT YEAR.

THUS IT CAN BE SEEN THAT THE CLUB NUMBERS ARE WELL DOWN ON PREVIOUS YEARS, SO LETS HOPE THE WEATHER IS KINDER NEXT YEAR AND PLAYERS COME FORWARD EAGER TO PLAY CRICKET.

#### PROPERTY STEWARDS REPORT

THIS WAS TO BE THE YEAR, AFTER MINIMAL PURCHASES IN THE PREVIOUS TWO YEARS TO ALLOW THE UPGRADING OF THE NETS AND TWO NEW SYNTHETIC PITCHES, FUNDS COULD THEN BE ALLOCATED TO CRICKET GEAR.

NEW BAGS WERE BROUGHT FOR THE TOP THREE SIDES, AND A REDUCED AMOUNT, BUT OF BETTER QUALITY GEAR, WAS MADE UP FOR THE 1ST ELEVEN BAG. THIS WAS TO SUPPLEMENT PLAYERS OWN EQUIPMENT, WHICH MAY BREAK DURING A GAME.

FULL SETS OF EQUIPMENT WERE PROVIDED FOR THE LOWER GRADE TEAMS.

AS HAS BEEN THE PRACTICE OVER THE LAST FEW SEASONS, EACH GROUND HAS ITS OWN SET OF STUMPS, BOUNDARY MARKERS AND THIS YEAR FIRST AID KITS WERE MADE UP IN THE SAME MANNER - ONE FOR EACH HOME GROUND ( AS PER R.D.C.A. RULE 19 (d).

WE NOW HAVE AMPLE SENIOR TRAINING EQUIPMENT, WHICH MEANS MATCH KITS REMAIN INTACT AND LESS WEAR AND TEAR ON THEM. JUNIOR TEAMS CONTINUE TO USE THEIR OWN AGE GROUP EQUIPMENT FOR TRAINING.

THE AVAILABILITY OF CRICKET BALLS IS A PROBLEM, EVERY GROUP WANTING PRACTICE BALLS, TEAMS WANTING HIT-UP BALLS ETC, AND THE COST OF EVEN A PRACTICE BALL IS AROUND \$1.2. WITH A LONG PRE-SEASON ON INDOOR CARPET WE CAN GO THROUGH 2-3 DOZEN BALLS.

NEXT YEAR DEPENDING ON HOW MANY TEAMS ARE FIELDED, CONTINUATION OF REPLACING STUMPS AND LOWER GRADE TEAM BAGS WILL BE THE PRIME OBJECTIVES.

MANY THANKS MUST BE GIVEN TO MURRAY PARKER FOR HIS DEVOTION IN REGULARY CLEANING THE TOILETS AND CLUB HOUSE, AND THE KITCHEN AT MILPERA.

ON A MORE POSITIVE NOTE I WAS VERY PLEASED TO SEE THE U16 PLAYERS TRAINING WITH THE SENIORS AND I WOULD LIKE TO THANK OUR CLUB COACH SCOTT SIMMONDS AND HIS FATHER DAVID, FOR THEIR ENCOURAGEMENT AND SUPPORT OF THESE JUNIOR PLAYERS. I WAS ALSO IMPRESSED WITH THE ENTHUSIASM DISPLAYED BY ALL THE U12 BOYS AND SAY THAT AS THEIR COACH, IT WAS A PLEASURE TO LOOK AFTER THEM.
