#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Once again the cricket season has drawn to a close with a mixed bag of success and personal achievements for a number of our Junior and Senior players.

Although our walls will have to wait for additions to our premiership flags, the season was still marked with many individual and future building successes. The most obvious success of the season was the consolidation in the Senior first XI of youthful players, giving the club an important foundation for season 90-91 with Templeton remaining in A grade cricket following the reduction in the number of teams in A grade by the R.D.C.A. This will affect all grades of Senior cricket in next season's competition as all matches will be competitive, which can only improve the standard of players prepared to meet their opportunities.

As we have a youthful club membership the services of experienced players will be vital to Templeton's future in the next few seasons while our younger players recieve the opportunity to perform and display the commitment necessary to maintain or improve their selected positions, ability alone is not enough as ambition and a commitment to succeed will be required to bring the rewards of personal and team achievements.

The season closes with a healthy membership overall, particularly in the vital Junior membership. Templeton's playing future looks extremely strong with many talented players in all our six junior sides, however, this must be supported in administration where there is an urgent requirement for more assistance in many areas of the club, and I take this opportunity to request that if you can assist in any way at all to please volunteer your services as they will be gratefully recieved.

An area of the club that will require a concentrated effort in season 90-91 and beyond is the question of income. As can be seen from the Treasurer's Report the expenses of providing sport, even at our club's level, is increasingly expensive and I personally feel that "social" sport is becoming a major expense in many families budgets, however sport is important in the development of youth and as an outlet for life's "pressures" and should be available to all who wish to participate. A strong move to find sponsorship is required and will be my priority over the winter months.

Templeton again performed on-field in a sporting and competitive nature although a few incidents arose during matches that required a reminder from the Executive that un-sporting behaviour will not be tolerated at Templeton and that we will continue to uphold our objectives of promoting good fellowship amongst members and encouraging the interests of cricket in general. This requires a self-discipline which was sometimes lacking in our opposition during the season.

I would like to thank all who assisted the club during the season, it takes the help and assistance of many people to keep the club functioning and I thank all helpers from the Junior parents that provided transport through to Norm Barnfield our hard-working Secretary - Thank-you All. In particular I wish to thank Paul Denton whose year-long dedication to Templeton was again evident as Social Secretary and his efforts in this vital position saved us all from digging into our pockets to cover a short-fall in budget.

In closing I offer my congratulations to all trophy winners and give my thanks to all club members for their support of myself, my committee and OUR club.

During season 1989/90, 68 senior and 75 junior players represented Templeton Cricket Club Incorporated.

Given the extraordinarily high rate of unavailability of senior players during the season, the Club would have been forced to forfeit matches in the lower grades had it not been for the assistance of junior players who also participated in senior matches. A special vote of thanks is extended to these junior members who helped the Club.

A pleasing aspect of this junior participation in senior matches was the performance of many of those players. By the end of the season, Under 16 players held four places in the First and Second Elevens. This will surely stand the Club in good stead for the years to come.

Once again, the junior teams acquitted themselves extremely well. The players are a credit to their families and the Club and I hope that they maintain a long association with us.

Unfortunately, fines due to incorrect completion of Match Result Sheets increased this season. With more time and care, such fines can be eliminated - a concerted effort must be made by all captains and team managers in this regard.

#### PROPERTY STEWARD'S REPORT

People may not realise the cost of equipping a cricket team, currently the basic gear in a team's bag costs around \$800; even for a Junior team it is the same, as the reduction in price for major items is cancelled out by the requirement to supply a couple of helmets per team. With the cost of a new ball per game and if a proportion for new bails, stumps etc are included it is an even \$1000; and we are fielding twelve teams!

To protect such investment I have been working towards providing two sets of practice gear, to be available as from the beginning of next season — so that the good match equipment will get less wear and tear, last longer and gradually be of a better quality to all teams.

Team Captains and their deputies appeared to have accepted the concept of there being a set (plus a spare) stumps at each ground; it is ridiculous for a club to have 90 odd stumps floating about when 5 sets (35) can do the job including spare sets. Ground pegs and flags were originally allocated to the grounds and for next season clearly marked tubs with the necessary pieces and a stiff broom will be placed at each ground. At the moment each set of gear will have the required pairs of batting gloves and boxes; but really in each persons own interests of personal hygiene everyone should buy their own pair of gloves and box, for an outlay of \$25 the Club can provide any player with both. For eventually if Club fees are to remain within acceptable limits to all players, the amount of equipment may be reduced to minimum requirements and a scheme in the form of a rebate on your subscription may apply to players who provide their own equipment. I noted many Junior players have their own bats and pads, and really all players who intend playing regularly for a few years should invest in their own equipment.

Congratulations to Pieter Bergshoeff for guiding the first through a difficult season with a largely inexperienced side; to the gallant 6th's who made the finals, and Gary Lear's under 14's. Also to Paul Denton who did a tremendous job in running the social side and providing cold drinks and food so regularly; his efforts made it possible for me to overrun my budget slightly and to scoop up some major items of equipment for next year, at last season's prices.

#### COACH 'S REPORT SEASON 1989/90

Season 89/90 commenced in excellent fashion with pre-season training attendances of over 30 being achieved from AUGUST'89. In fact training attendances throughout the year were generally outstanding with over 40 players attending most training sessions with peaks of 50 being attained.

This sorely tested our training facilities and resources, with the Club needing to urgently address the inadequacies prevalent with the standard of our practice nets.

Unfortunately the enthusiasm shown by the majority of players in their attendance to training could not be sustained in providing match winning performances on a consistent basis throughout the season.

From the beginning of the season it became clear, that due principally to the loss of 6 regular first eleven players from the previous year for various reasons, we would struggle to field an experience First Eleven which in turn had a snowball effect throughout the lower Grades.

Notwithstanding this, Season 89/90 was successful in that a large number of our more youthful Club members, were given the opportunity to display their talents against stronger opposition than they may have anticipated in doing, let alone having been accustomed to.

With the experience gained by these players, we look forward with some confidence that the "Ground-work" done during this season should begin to provide some reward next season and the years ahead,

Templeton Cricket Club is in the envious position of having substantial raw talent available within it's ranks, and providing that these players commit themselves wholeheartedly, we can look forward to more consistent performances from them and ultimately a couple may go on to play District cricket.

Disappointingly, all sides were let down by a lack of commitment by a few players throughout the season, either due to a lack of training, making themselves unavailable and above all else not showing up on the day of a game.

Consistently my fellow selectors and I were hindered in selecting settled sides or even forced to promote players in some instances before they were ready, due to the regular or prolonged occurrences that some players made themselves unavailable for selection. This was made even more difficult by the number of instances that players withdrew on a Thursday night or Saturday morning from selected sides.

Despite this my sincere gratitude goes to all those people who at varying times throughout the season were called upon to proffer their expertise at the selection table, often in trying circumstances in ensuring that the Club's selection policy was enforced and adhered, to throughout the season which I believe will serve the Club well in ensuing seasons.

My Appreciation also goes to the Executive Committee and players for their support during the season. For the fear of omitting any one individual, I also thank those who assisted at training in varying capacities during the season.

Finally I must mention Paul Denton's untiring efforts during the season and particularly for the fine cuisine that he arranged for the selectors on selection nights.

In closing, I feel confident that if each and every member is to give a total commitment to the Club next season more satisfying results will be achieved. Please remember that just a minor lack of commitment by just a few will ultimately be detrimental to the overall success of the Club and I therefore implore on everyone to reflect on the season just gone and review where they not only may have let themselves down but the CLUB.

#### 2ND ELEVEN CAPTAINS REPORT

At the commencement of Season 1989/90 the Executive Committee appointed Stewart Lambrick Captain of the Second XI.

Losing badly to Montrose in the following game (we could only manage 74 runs) was a sign that our batting depth was not as strong as first thought.

Stewart was promoted to the Firsts, and I found myself Captain; we beat Croydon Hockeyers and lost to Glen Park, at this stage of the season 4 wins from 6 games.

Then Glen Park, Scoresby, Kilsyth, Olinda and Eastfield dashed any finals aspirations we held. In the final two rounds a win against Eastfield and a fortunate rain delayed draw against South Wantirna completed our season.

11 games played - 5 wins, 1 draw, 5 losses.

In the final analysis, we were unable to put pressure on opposition batsmen by consistently bowling line and length or put pressure of opposition bowlers by playing straight and waiting for the bad ball to put away, in the meantime picking up singles to keep the scoreboard moving along.

Concentration and a commitment to regular training sessions is the only way I know of to rectify these deficiencies.

Season 1990/91 should be an enjoyable experience, if all players Senior and Junior build on their opportunities from 1989/90, and I am hopeful that this will be the case.

I look forward to seeing you all in 1990/91, please have a safe and happy winter.
