HISTORY OF TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB INC.

Club Colours - Red & Blue

Early in 1983, when the Templeton Sporting Complex was nearing completion, the Committee of Management advertised through local papers for submissions from local residents interested in forming new sporting clubs or established clubs wishing tenancy of Templeton Reserve.

Our Secretary, Mr. N. Barnfield, then Secretary of Ainslie Park Cricket Club with Mr. P. Denton, Templeton Treasurer, then Treasurer also with Ainslie Park, decided that they would seek a series of meetings with local residents, Ward Councillors and possible sponsors, with a view to forming a new cricket club in the area.

The rapid expansion in the area surrounding the complex plus the obvious benefits the reserve offered, were the basis of this decision. A public meeting was held at the reserve on Friday, 15th July, 1983. The meeting was chaired by the President of the Ringwood District Cricket Association, Mr. W. Dean, and attended by current Mayor of Knox, Councillor G. Draper.

It must be said there were several people who attended this public meeting who were not in favour of an additional cricket club in the area. On checking their bona-fides most of these dissidents did not reside in Knox and therefore were not allowed voting rights on the issue. From this meeting a caretaker committee was formed to establish the club which was to be called the Templeton Cricket Club. An application was forwarded to the R.D.C.A. for affiliation and to the Templeton Committee of Management for tenancy. In due course both applications were successful and the Templeton Cricket Club was underway.

1983/84 saw Templeton Cricket Club field 3 Senior sides in B. B Reserve and E. Grades and 3 Junior sides in U/14-4, U/12-3 and U/12-5.

The B side had an excellent season, finishing 4th but unfortunately being defeated in the semi-final by Ringwood. Games played - Won 8, Drawn 1, Lost 3. B Reserve played with plenty of promise but was not consistent enough winning 4 games out of 11. E Grade was a similar story to B Reserve players enjoying themselves but lacking consistent form winning 3 games out of 11.

U/14-4. The boys teamed together well but many players playing their first season of cricket could not cope with the more seasoned lads of the competition winning 4 games out of 10. U/12-3. The lads played exceptional cricket and were unlucky not to finish in the final four winning 5, drawing 1 out of 10 games played. U12-5. This grade is not played for points but is a learning process and the younger less experienced boys fought hard to improve their skills and improve they did, with a magnificent effort winning 7 games out of 10.

Season 1983/84 was particularly successful both on and off the field for Templeton Cricket Club and in reading the 1984/85 Annual Report you, the members and parents, can make up your own minds how the Club performed during this season.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Here we are at the end of another successful cricket season. Having overcome the traumas of establishing the club last season and building up team spirit, we reaped the benefits this year. This was apparent in training, on-field performances and social activities. I was pleased to see all club members involving themselves in training and social activities from the start. This involvement has shown dividends now with our 1st X1 and U/16 teams playing in the finals, unfortunately neither team reached the grand final.

Our junior teams had quite a successful season, our two U/12 and two U/14 teams who are our future senior members performed very well. I give my heartiest congratulations to our U/16 team in earning a place in the finals by finishing second after the home and away games, sadly they could not progress to the grand final. Another aspect of our junior teams is the involvement of senior players and parents at training and Saturday morning games. Unfortunately this has been left to a very few who have regularly shouldered the burden. We can never have too many helpers. If you can spare a little time on a training night or Saturday morning please let us know and come along. I'm sure the boys would appreciate it.

I would like to congratulate all the members of our 1st X1 team on securing a position in the finals again. This season has shown us one thing and that is that we have not slipped back from the end of the 83/84 season. All members contributed to the team's success in one way or another, but one person who stands out is Pieter Bergshoeff. My warmest congratulations to you Pieter in winning the R.D.C.A. Medal for the best and fairest player in B Grade. Our other three senior teams fared well in different aspects, a few previously unknown talents came to light so that we can look forward to a successful 85/86 season. To all senior members and to the U/16 players who played in the seniors, congratulations on a season well played in good spirit and sportsmanship.

I would like to thank my Social Secretary and his Committee on a job well done. The Social Secretary has one of the hardest jobs in the club and but for the support of all club members and a lot of hard work from his committee we could not have finished on a note as good as we have. Our special thanks to Lyn, Judy and Andrea and all the other ladies for their tireless work in the canteen over the season. We are grateful to the Templeton Committee of Management who have again shown their confidence in us, in allowing us to continue to use the grounds and facilities. To my wife I give a special thank you for all she has put up with and for her support throughout the season. In closing I offer my congratulations to all trophy winners and give my thanks to all club members for their support of myself, my committee and OUR CLUB.

U/16 GRADE 4 COACH'S REPORT

A total of 17 boys comprised the squad from which to pick a team for each game; of this, seven had definite ability, another seven had some ability in one direction or another and three were enthusiastic. We were fortunate that almost every batting position could be covered by two or three players. There were at least three wicket keepers and in any team selection we went in with six bowlers. The weakness was in the slow bowling department made unfashionable by first-class cricket.

The top half of the batting order revolved around Tim Lambrick, Richard Weidemann, Brett Conway, Martin Wood and Stewart Lambrick, with Brett and Richard making several scores of 30 or more, The Lambrick's often got a start into double figures but then got out as did Martin. The latter played an excellent innings of 88 against Park Orchards and would have completed a century if he had not put the interests of the team first, going for an outright. The middle order often faltered, the highest fifth wicket partnership for the season being 17.

We were fortunate to have 3 boys who could hit as hard as men, Andrew Rickard, Joshua Stanley and Mark Bennett. The first two made several match winning scores and in quick time which gave us respectable totals to bowl against. There were disappointing performances by some of the lower order batsmen who showed signs of having the correct technique but in limited chances did not really take advantage to make a score and gain confidence in themselves.

The bowling was shared between Martin Wood, Brett Conway and Stewart Lambrick. All bowled well with plenty of life and tried to think batsmen out. They were well supported by Mark Bennett Simon Lovett, Jamie Mullen, Nasif Gierdien and Richard Weidemann. Alistair Pitman was our only slow bowler and although ne only took one wicket with his legspin, it was one of the most important of the season and he should persevere with his style. Tim Lambrick kept wicket very well and in keeping the sundries down made the bowler's figures a little more respectable than they might have been. Josh Stanley and Alistair Pitman also took a turn behind the stumps and performed competently.

With so many boys, individual attention to correct faults and develop individual talents was limited. This also applied to the fielding to develop specialist slip and gully fielders. We were fortunate to have several good cover/mid wicket fielders. Stewart fielded brilliantly and top performances were given by Richard, Martin and Brett. Adrian Hyland was always keen and a useful and versatile team member in the field and able to bat in several positions. Brendan Moll our only left-handed batsman, Nasif Gierdien who can bat and bowl, Alistair Pitman and Simon Lovett, all showed signs of ability and need to work harder on all aspects of their game.

Stewart led the side well and ran the changes in accordance with the team plan but was a little slow to adjust the field placings against the more aggressive batsmen. Due to weak fixtures, we cruised into the finals without being extended

and this was our downfall when after a steady start we were in a position at the tea break to build a respectable score but undisciplined batting saw us lose four wickets for twelve runs in fifteen minutes after the break. Apart from a brief revival for the seventh wicket the tail also failed to get their heads down and bat out time. Defending 121 runs was a tough task and sloppy fielding on the first day let Ainslie Park get to 39 for 1 wicket. We did not get an early breakthrough on the second day and they passed our score with only the one wicket down.

We lose six players to the senior ranks but there is a core of eight remaining, around which a useful team can be built. The boys were very supportive of each other and the team's non-players turning up to watch, but they must apply themselves more during training and when fielding in matches and not leave the field for any excuse.

The accompanying averages tell their own story, Martin Wood and Brett Conway being the most prolific scorers and leading wicket takers with Richard Weidemann and Andrew Rickard also scoring more than 100 runs and Stewart Lambrick the only other bowler to take more than 10 wickets in the season.

U/12 GRADE 2 COACH'S REPORT

My opening remarks last season were that the future of the club is in good hands and I see no reason to change my thoughts following our second season.
