TREASURERS REPORT- SEASON 2001/02

Notes forming part of the Financial Statements

INCOME

BAR

A decrease in income of \$11026.00 is explained by the following factors. A quieter social year due to 12.00 finishes after Christmas, the lack of success of the firsts and the general lack of numbers on most Thursday's and Saturday's as the season progressed. Accounting policies were changed this year resulting in \$4,000 in income showing elsewhere in the Profit and Loss statement.

Subscriptions

Decrease of \$320 from the previous season due mainly to the One Day team having a number of forfeits for the year.

Canteen

The non use of the canteen due to its incomplete state was a major loss of revenue for the season. Last year's profit was \$1900.00

Club Merchandise

This is the money received from players as payment for Club merchandise. This amount is lower than expenses as we still have a large amount of stock on hand.

Afternoon Tea

We made a profit of \$25 for the season.

Sponsors/Donations

We had the one major sponsor for the season being Inspirational Tiling.

Social Fundraising

From a financial perspective this season was successful in the area of social/fundraising. The social levy worked well with approximately 70% of players using their free admittance to most social functions. Kristi introduced some new functions this year which were well received by players and their friends.

Other Income

We received \$982 from the winding up of the Templeton Advisory Committee.

EXPENSES

Cricket Balls

Expenditure increased due to the cost of balls and a larger number were used during the season.

Bank Charges

The Credit Card Merchant facility accrued charges of \$447.06 from credit card spending of \$10140.00 Credit card spending decreased by \$2563.00 for this season. Government charges of \$136.20 were incurred for the season.

Equipment

The purchase/ renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. This year expenditure was reduced by \$1130.00 due to the purchase of extra equipment last season and the abolition of cricket kits in the higher grades.

Bar

Expenditure increased by \$1423.00 during the season.

Club Merchandise

Increase \$2088 this year due to the purchase of new cricket shirts. We currently have \$3,000 in stock of various merchandising items.

Coaching

This amount consists of payments to our paid coaches and players and increased by \$1182.00 from last season.

Meat

Increase of \$577.00 due to the increase in cost and consumption. The barbeque ran at a loss of \$358.00 for the season.

Ground Maintenance

This included costs for the maintenance of the nets at Templeton and the ongoing maintenance of Templeton oval during the season. This expenditure was down \$1366.00 from last season due to the covering and uncovering of Templeton oval and not having a part time curator at Templeton this year.

Ground Fees

Increase in fees of \$689.00 which is unavoidable with our large number of teams.

Power/Gas

Increase of \$746.00 from last season as electricity bills at Milpera totalling \$527.00 were not paid from the previous season as bills were never sent.

RDCA

Decrease in costs of \$204.00 for the year. An excellent effort by all concerned with only a \$20 fine for the year.

Social/Fundraising

This includes payments for functions during the year. DJ's, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred in presenting functions for the players.

Telephone

Increase of \$851.00 due to the connection of 2 new phone lines for the use of Templeton Cricket Club only. One line is for the use of the internet/fax machine and this has increased our ongoing monthly costs.

Trophies

An increase of \$46.00 from last season.

Fines

A fine of \$450 was incurred due to a second breach of our Liquor Licence Hours during the season. A third offence results in the loss of our licence.

A player must play in more than half the matches contested by his team and score not less than 100 runs and bowl not less than 200 balls.

JUNIOR TROPHIES

- (1) A Batsman must play in more than half the matches contested in that grade and score runs as per the following table :-*
- (2) A bowler must play in more than half the matches contested in that grade and bowl in that grade at least the number of ball as per the following table :-*

ALL ROUNDER

A player must play in more than half the matches contested by his team and score more than half the Runs required to qualify for a batting trophy in that grade and bowl not less than half the balls required to qualify for a bowling trophy in that grade.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

The Senior Club Champion will be a player from the Clubs first eleven who has achieved the most accumulated points during the season.

The Junior Club Champion will be the player who has achieved the most points during the season.

Calculations for both Club Champions will be based on the following points allocation :-
