## TREASURERS REPORT SEASON 2000/2001

The goal for the Templeton Cricket Club in season 2000/2001 was to purchase 2 new cricket pitches, improve Templeton Cricket oval, turnaround last season's deficit and record a surplus.

We did achieve those goals and financially the Club did extremely well. We recorded a surplus of \$17031.51 for the season, which is a \$18198.00 turnaround from the previous season.

There were a number of major reasons why this surplus occurred and they were:

- 1. Bar takings increased by \$22129.00 from last season due to the full use of kegs for the season, success of the sides especially the firsts and a limited number of outside parties.
- 2. A highly successful Superdraw function which made a profit of \$5370.00 and had bar takings in excess of \$3000.00 for the day. Thank you to Brett Gibb and Jason Disney for another successful Superdraw, which was enjoyed by everybody that attended.
- 3. Sponorship was made a priority and Jason Disney was able to attract \$4200.00 in funds, a \$4000.00 turnaround from last season.

#### INCOME

#### **Subscriptions**

(Refer Annexure A)

#### Canteen

The canteen was operated by volunteers each Saturday and made a profit of \$1900.05 for the season, including a \$1000.00 profit on the semi-final weekend at Templeton.

#### Club Merchandise

This is the money received from players as payment for Club merchandise. This amount is lower than expenses as we still have a large amount of stock on hand.

#### Sponsors/Donations

An excellent year with a number of sponsors obtained and a \$4000.000 turnaround from last season.

#### Social Fundraising

From a financial perspective this season was successful in the area of social/fundraising. The social levy worked well with approximately 70% of players using their free admittance to most social functions. Kristi introduced some new functions this year which were well received by players and their friends.

#### <u>Subscriptions</u>

An increase in student, junior and Milo players numbers resulted in a \$1780.00 increase in income.

#### Other Income

This consists of other/unusual income. Income of \$1040.00 was from the players for their trip away and \$500.00 was from the Templeton Reserve Committee for the bar improvements.

#### **EXPENSES**

#### Cricket Balls

Expenditure same as last season.

#### **Bank Charges**

The Credit Card Merchant facility accrued charges of \$488.00 from credit card spending of \$12703.00 Credit card spending increased by \$1406.00 for this season. Government charges of \$133.00 were incurred for the season. Financial Institutions Duty is being abolished on 01/07/01.

#### Equipment

The purchase/ renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. Next year playing equipment will be available for the lower grades only.

#### Bar

Expenditure increased by \$9143.00 but was offset by a \$22129.00 increase in income, which was a great year for the bar.

#### Coaching

This amount consists of payments to our paid coaches and players and increased by \$4066.00 from last season, primarily due to the good year of the firsts.

#### Ground Maintenance

This included costs for the uncovering and covering of Templeton and the ongoing maintenance of Templeton oval during the season. This expenditure was up \$818.00 from last season.

#### **Ground Fees**

Decrease in fees of \$353.00 was caused by the loss of Knox College this season.

#### **RDCA**

An increase in costs of \$319.00 for the year.

#### Social/Fundraising

This includes payments for functions during the year. DJ's, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred in presenting functions for the players.

## **Trophies**

An increase of \$500.00 from last season due to Senior premierships, the setup of artwork for future years trophies and the purchase of new perpetual trophies.

#### Other Expenses

Payments not included elsewhere. These expenses include the cricket trip away \$1040.00, umpire payments in finals \$350.00, players insurance \$195.00 and Milo program \$880.00

A player must play in more than half the matches contested by his team and score not less than 100 runs and bowl not less than 200 balls.

#### JUNIOR TROPHIES

- (1) A Batsman must play in more than half the matches contested in that grade and score runs as per the following table:-
- (2) A bowler must play in more than half the matches contested in that grade and bowl in that grade at least the number of ball as per the following table:-

#### ALL ROUNDER

A player must play in more than half the matches contested by his team and score more than half the Runs required to qualify for a batting trophy in that grade and bowl not less than half the balls required to qualify for a bowling trophy in that grade.

#### CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

The Senior Club Champion will be a player from the Clubs first eleven who has achieved the most accumulated points during the season.

The Junior Club Champion will be the player who has achieved the most points during the season.

Calculations for both Club Champions will be based on the following points allocation :-

5 Points
15 Points
10 Points
5 Points per player
10 Points
10 Points

#### Seconds Captains report
