Expenses

Cricket Balls – Expenditure was received by \$1,170 from last season due to the reduction in teams, purchase of balls in bulk at reduced prices and the reduced number of second innings games this season.

Bank Charges

The credit card merchant facility accrued charges of \$352 from credit card spending of \$7,304. We will look at increasing next season's fee for credit card cash advances to \$1.

Equipment

The purchase / renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense running a cricket club. This year was no different to any other year and the cricket kits were maintained at the same high level. During the year a purchase of discounted cricket gear was made for next years cricket season.

Social / Fundraising

This includes payments for the functions during the year: DJ's, Raffle prizes, & all other expenses incurred trying to raise a dollar.

Telephone Expenses

A reduction in costs this year, is due to the stricter control of the telephone and collection of fees.

Other Expenses

Payments not included elsewhere. These expenses include – Cricket Trip \$3,230. Indoor Cricket Training \$1,000. Ground Maintenance, Insurance, Liquor Licence, Physio & the T.C.C. Post Office Box.

During the year a new cricket pitch and Bar B Que were purchased.
