# GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow Members,

Reviewing season 1985/86 Templeton Cricket Club Incorporated players, supporters and general committee can be well pleased with our on field performances. Our sportsmanship and sense of fair play has been praised by the Ringwood & District Cricket Association and our reputation as a club to be respected and admired is rapidly growing.

There has been many highlights during the past season culminating with a "B" Reserve Premiership (the first of many!!), our outstanding achievement. Conversely the disappointment of our First X1 failing to reach the grand final after a strong batting performance in the semi-final and our courageous U/14-3 team just failing to clinch the pennant, being bitter pills to swallow.

As General Secretary during the past three years my responsibility has been ensuring the club administration is functioning competently with off field problems handled quietly and efficiently. In the main I believe all executive members over this period of time have performed their duties to the best of their respective abilities.

Our major concern has been to endeavour to make decisions that will enable Templeton Cricket Club to function not only during the current season but for future seasons to come. Our continuance as an expanding and successful club is dependant on proper planning and a dedicated band of people who are prepared to accept a position on the committee and give their best for the club.

Templeton Cricket Club has a restricted liquor licence - registered under the incorporations act of 1981 - and fully covered for Public Liability. A significant achievement in only three years of management.

I have listed some of our successes but to show members there is always work left to be done in permanently establishing our club, I feel duty bound to list several areas of conern which must be rectified as soon as practicable. We have not reached an harmonious working relationship with our co-tenants, the Wantirna Football Club, and until both clubs work with the best interests of the reserve and local residents in mind and put aside parochial interests, the lower pavilion will never achieve it's full potential.

Knox Council must be convinced to erect cyclone netting around our practice wickets (we also desperately require an additional practice wicket). The current situation of netting is totally unsuitable and unsafe, especially for junior training.

Permanent tenancy of three ovals must be negotiated with Knox Council and the R.D.C.A. We have secured Templeton Reserve and hopefully Milpera Reserve will be negotiated to our satisfaction from 1986/87. Schultz Reserve is too costly and the playing surface is unsuitable for junior cricket and detracts from the standard of senior cricket. This leaves another suitable oval to be secured.

So you can see the committee is aware of our problems and I can assure members, sub-committees have been formed to ensure all avenues are explored in achieving success.

I thank all executive personnel for their support and assistance throughout 1985/86 especially to Paul Owen for without Paul's assistance my work load would be far greater than it is. His work in the incorporation and licencing documentation has gone unheralded and it should not be so.

To my family I thank them for their support and patience. Family set backs were overcome with the help of our many friends in the club and we thank you all for your friendship and thoughts.

To our sponsors our sincere gratitude for your valued and most appreciated support. Templeton Cricket Club welcomes the umpires of the Yarra Valley Mountain District Umpires' Association who have been accepted into the lower complex by the Committee of Management as co-tenants with the football and cricket clubs. May their stay with us be long and rewarding for all. Concluding, I have great pleasure in presenting Templeton Cricket Club's Annual Report and Financial Statements for season 1985/86 at this our 3rd Annual General Meeting.

After two seasons establishing ourselves as a competitive combination, season 1985/86 presented the biggest challenge to the 'B' Grade team. The Club was again fortunate to recruit well, resulting in a strengthening of all senior teams. The experienced Barry McClure and youthful Wayne Peters proved reliable contributors, whilst Grant Senior batted his way through all grades and was justly rewarded with two appearances in 'B' Grade, including the semi-final. The improvement of Stan Pamieta, John Nightingale and the emergence of Michael Litchfield as an opening bowler and punishing middle-order batsman, gave the team balance and more depth. Consistent batting performances were again recorded throughout the season by Neville Walker, Eddie Hicks and Murray Parker and Trevor Tormey shouldered much of the bowling duties with good success.

Every effort was made to ensure that as many boys as possible played cricket during the season. Where byes or forfeits were experienced alternative games were arranged with other clubs.

Whilst there has been some improvement in the standard of junior cricket at Templeton, as can be seen in the number of new records set and the excellent performances attained by a number of players, I believe that there is still much to be done in this area. With the introduction of a synthetic wicket, better training facilities and, hopefully, a junior coaching co-ordinator, further improvements will be forthcoming.

May I congratulate all the trophy winners and also those that did not win trophies but contributed to the excellent team performances during the year. Always remember that teams win matches not individuals. (An example is the Second X1). I would especially like to congratulate TIM LUTTICK on winning the R.D.C.A. U/14 Grade 5 Bowling Average.

Finally, I apologise to anyone I have omitted to thank individually in the above report. My final thanks go to the Executive Committee in supporting me throughout the season and my team captain, Mick Banbury, for putting up with me arriving late some Saturdays for the Second's game.

I look forward to an even more rewarding season in 1986/87.

# U/16 GRADE 2 COACH'S REPORT

The team lost 3 games in the last over, 1 by 1 run, another by 6 runs (both before Christmas) and then to the top side in a controversial finish, by 4 runs. We had a basis of 6 boys from last year's side and 3 new comers who added considerable strength to the team besides some of the boys up from U/14's having a game or two for experience.

The batting revolved around Dean Walch and Martin Wood and solid innings from Tim Luttick who found his best position down the order. Jeremy Boxall and Adrian Hyland had disappointing seasons yet Adrian proved later on in the season he has the temperament and ability to become a solid opener - playing in a senior final's series.

One of our problems was of finding a solid opening partnership. Brendan Noll, Martin Wood and Gavin Baldan were also tried, with Jeremy, Adrian, Brendan and Martin making useful scores. Gavin Baldan in his first year in competitive cricket, quickly picked up the basics in the Second X1 and become a useful and forceful middle order batsman. Jamie Mullen improved considerably and can become a competent batsman with more concentration. This applied to all of the top order batsmen, who got a start but only one went on to make over 50 runs in an innings.

The bowling centred around Martin Wood, Jamie Mullen from last year, with extra pace from Dean Walch and Gavin Baldan. Martin, Jamie and Dean each took 5 or more wickets in a match; ably supported by Brendan Noll and Michael Levi each producing effective spells of off-spin bowling and must have confidence in themselves and practice hard at this particular skill. They can both be useful all-rounders if they work at their game.
