Thanks should go to Kristi Disney for her continued efforts in this area and to Renee Weidemann who as Social Sixes Coordinator, ensured that this program was a great experience for participants. I would also like to thank Steve Mikecz who played a pivotal role in getting our women's side up and running, and to all our players who made this team a great success. I look forward to watching this team develop over coming years.

Also pleasing was the number of junior girls who played Saturday afternoon cricket in male competitions throughout the season.

An important aspect of our continuing journey towards being an inclusive club was our inaugural Women's Day function to raise funds for the Breast Cancer Network Australia. With over 60 attendees and \$3061 raised, this day proved to be an outstanding success. I am

very appreciative of the tireless work of Vicki Vozzo and Kristi Disney in organising the day and ensuring that it was a memorable event for all who attended.

Another first for our Club was the "Taste of the World" night which was well supported by a large number of junior families. Whilst the obvious outcome was this provided our members with an opportunity to sample dishes from other countries, more importantly this event celebrated the multicultural nature of our Club. I look forward to this event being a regular on our social calendar.

This season we spent a considerable amount of focus on our off field structures to better support our members and improve our club. The appointment of Ryan Gill in the role of Member Wellbeing Office signals our intent to better support the mental health and wellbeing of our members, particularly during a time when many will be dealing with the impacts of the pandemic. In this role, Ryan organised an opportunity for all members to participate in a Mental Health Awareness Training Session delivered by Headspace. We look forward to doing more to assist our members in the 2022/23 season.

Another accomplishment that will be of benefit into the future was our acceptance into the Sports & Life Training (SALT) "Clubs with Heart" course that ran for 8 sessions from September to March. This course, which provides insights into how to become a great club on and off the field, has provided us with a platform in which to become more successful into the future. This will at times challenge how we have done things historically, but I am confident that we will become a better club for our members, families and community. Thank you to Ryan Gill and Para Ekanayake for participating in this program.

On field, our focus was again upon continuing to develop our young playing list whilst being competitive on the field. After the disappointment of being relegated the previous season, our First XI had it sights set on returning Trollope Shield. This was particularly the case given the retention of the playing list the previous season and the return of Joshua Hudson. Unfortunately, after a dominant season, our form did not translate into the finals series and

we suffered two disappointing loses. However, with a young talented list and more hard work, I am sure that a period of sustained success is not far away. The rewards of our ongoing focus on youth development was evidenced by our 4th XI making finals on the back of the performances of a number of young players mixed with a core of experienced players.

To prepare for a season with 12 junior teams and to ensure that the season runs smoothly is a monumental task. Senior Coach's Report

I am writing this report after what can only be defined as another successful year for the Senior Taipans. Whilst the ultimate prize of a 1stXI premiership wasn't achieved, the club far outweighed expectations both on and off the field as we continue our growth towards sustained success across all grades.

Over the season we had 98 players, male and female, and from ages 12 up to 60+, pull on the Taipan colours! This is a monumental number and shows us the interest and support across our club community for what we are doing... and to me this point is the thing that matters more than any other measurement of success.

On-field, all teams achieved so much this year, and I list a few comments that I would like to bring to the forefront for us all to focus on as we build into our Future.

<u>1stXI</u> — We are built perfectly for a period of sustained success. We had our youngest ever debutante for the club in Jackson Edwards, three of the top five run scorers in the whole league, and three of the top fifteen wicket takers. The sky is the limit if we keep working hard, and I have no doubt we will be celebrating the ultimate team success here within the short term

<u>2ndXI</u> – When I first joined as coach three years ago this team was made of a bunch of kids, and a few senior cricketers. This team now is a genuine 2ndXI team, positioned back in the Premier Grades of the RDCA, and went from avoiding relegation in the last round of the season last year to still being in the mix for finals with a fortnight to go in the year this season. Our next wave of 1stXI cricketers play here, and are going to be pushing for a spot in the top grade before we know it

<u>3rdXI</u> – After losing a few senior cricketers from this grade for this season, this team morphed somewhat into a development squad this season with a handful of seniors there to support. Whilst the impacts of the senior guys will never be discounted, the on-field 5th position result from the season was very much carried by a bunch of young men aged 14-17yo. The future is bright for the Taipans!

<u>4thXI</u> – Of all the teams I was most concerned about at the start of the season, this was the one! Promoted three grades from where we finished fourth last year, I thought we would be in for a tough year here... but it simply wasn't the case! A team aptly managed balancing a mix of experience and youth, saw the team perform well above my own personal expectations and make the finals!

<u>5thXI</u> – Whilst not winning a match for the season, this is the squad that I am most proud of. It is the entry point to our senior division, and we gave so many young cricketers an opportunity to play for the Taipans throughout the year. 39 players played in the squad, and this is such an important thing as we continue to grow and develop our senior division into the future.

I think we can all agree that the club is on the right track, and I am just lucky enough to have a been able to play a small part in that over the last three years... and look forward to continuing the journey again next year for my fourth. With a new coaching structure, new ideas, and more people actively helping – I am confident the player experience will again be taken to another level for season 2022/23.

In closing, I would like to thank a number of people for their support and assistance over the 2021/22 season because without you we would never be able to so successfully get 5 teams and 60 players onto the ground each week.

To Sean Meehan, Jason Disney and the entire Templeton Committee I thank you for your support of myself and the playing group, but more importantly for your endless hours of work put into our great club. Without people like you, the club would just not be in the strong position that it is today.

To all of the senior captains for the year, I sincerely thank you for your input, feedback and tireless (and in many cases thankless) work over the season. The impact that you as people have made to the young cricketers of this club will be remembered by them for the rest of their lives... so be proud of everything you do.

And last but definitely not least, to Melissa and my family, I thank you for allowing me to do what I love. It takes many hours of commitment, and at times cricket can impact our personal lives – and for supporting all of that I will be forever grateful.

Port Melbourne Containers First XI Season Report Bill Wilkins Cup

After being relegated back to Wilkins for season 2021/22 we were able to retain our core group of players while adding ex-junior Josh Hudson to the squad, who returned after successful stints at sub district and premier level.

Following a wash out in round 1, we travelled to Warrandyte for our first game of the year. On a fast and small ground our bowlers were able to take 10 wickets inside 39 overs and restrict Warrandyte to 161. Huddo was influential in his opening spell bowling four maidens while Tys took 3 wickets from the other end. Luke Christey and Jack Meehan showed their importance in the mid to late overs, taking 2 wickets each. Opening the batting with Coady Mitrevski (69) and myself (35) were able to put on 69 runs inside 10 overs setting up a fairly simple run chase as we passed their score in the 29th over at 4/162.

We played Bayswater Park in our first game at Temps in round 3. Bowling first, our openers again went well with Huddo (1/33) taking a wicket on the third ball of the innings while Nudge (2/35) picked up 2 wickets at the other end. Their middle order rebuilt and were able to get away from us after drinks before we were able to restrict them in the last 10 thanks to Luke Christey (2/40) and Jack Meehan (1/19). Chasing 183 to win Coads (35) and I (62) were again able to make use of the new ball, putting on 93 runs before the first wicket fell in the 9th over. Nudge (35) and Ben Gerloff (48) then comfortably saw us home in the 33rd over with the loss of only 2 wickets.

Our first real challenge came in round 4 against St Andrews for top spot on the ladder. Batting first Coads (98) continued his good run of form hitting 9 fours and a 6 to fall agonisingly short of his first Temps ton. Together with Loffy (37) they put on 99 for the 2nd wicket before Nudge (57 off 40 balls) was required to hit out following a hamstring strain on his first ball. Defending 247, early wickets from Huddo (1/39) and Chunk (2/38) made it extremely difficult for St Andrews. Tys bowling first change had his best spell of the year taking 2/21 off his 8 while Twisty (2/44) and Jack (2/32) continued taking wickets. A ton from the opposition captain meant St Andrews batted their 40 to make 203 still 47 runs short of our total.

Sitting a game clear on top, we suffered our first loss of the year against Warranwood in round 5. A poor bowling performance saw them post 229 at temps. Our innings never got going losing consistent wickets to end up on 148 all out. Coads (48) was able to provide some respectability to our score, while at 15 years of age Jackson Edwards (23 off 21) played an impressive debut knock against a quality bowling attack.

From this stage onwards our depth in talent was on display as we dominated rounds 6-13 with a number of bats making big scores and an even spread of bowlers taking wickets. Some stand-out performances included posting scores of 297 and 306 against Wonga Park and bowling Bayswater Park and St Andrews out for 100 and 130 respectively. Some individual highlights included Coads posting his first ton for Templeton in our second outing against Warranwood. While with the ball Luke Christey took his first ever 5 wicket haul in the same game on his way to claiming the bowling award for the club.

In round 14 we played who we thought were our biggest threats for the flag in East Ringwood. After posting 215 with the bat, Josh Hudson looked the most likely with the ball taking 2/22 off his 8. However, with no one being able to bowl in a partnership with Huddo, East Ringwood eventually passed our score 3 wickets down.

This meant we finished the home and away season 2 games clear on top of the ladder setting up a Qualifying final against East Ringwood at home. Batting first, East Ringwood were steady at 0/33 before an injury to one of their openers allowed for Huddo to take the crucial wicket of the opposition captain for 2. From there a Cameo from their number 4 bat looked to tip the momentum towards East Ringwood before Luke Christey (3/21) and Niraj de-Siva (3/15) tore through their middle order, with Tys (3/17) finishing the job to have East Ringwood all out for 132. Following a lengthy rain delay Loffy joined Coads at the crease after I was out in the first over. Together they scrapped to 33 against a disciplined bowling attack. From there we lost 6 wickets for 20 runs to have the score at 7/53. When Tys was run out with the score at 8/68, Heath Disney (24) and Luke Christey (19) put on 30 runs for the 9th wicket before we were eventually all out for 109.

In our second chance to qualify for a Grand final, we played Bayswater Park in a prelim. Batting first, we could not have asked for a better start with an opening stand of 106 with the first wicket falling in the 21st over. When Coads (50) was dismissed at 2/135, we had our second batting collapse in as many weeks losing our next 8 wickets for 28 runs. Defending 166 we were unable to crack their opening pair who put the game beyond doubt with a stand of 121, eventually passing our score 2 down.

As good as we were in the home and away season, we were unable to perform in the pressure of finals. However, with the obvious wealth of talent within our squad there is no doubt we will be back in premiership contention with a chance to make amends next season.
