Sincere thanks to Scott Simmonds, Ray Megarry, Ken Colwell, Michael Goyne, Terry Shanly and John Nightingale for their tremendous contribution to our successful year and to Paul Owen for completing the thankless task of Chairman of Selectors.

I thank the executive members for their hard work and support during the season.

The future of the club is in our own hands. There is a need for some new blood on the executive committee to instill new ideas, thoughts and direction. The present committee have served you well, however like all management teams, people retire, suffer burnout and alike, this creates opportunity for others.

Thankyou Templeton Cricket Club for all the pleasure you have given me and my family and I wish the club every success in the future.

TREASURERS REPORT

The following 1994/95 financial statement has been prepared on an accrual basis.

The Club's financial year actually finishes on 30 April however, as the Presentation Night was held in May it was decided to include the income and expenditure associated with this function in the 1994/95 financial statement. This allows income and expenses to be matched against the year in which they were derived or incurred.

Although the final balance looks quite healthy there is a known expenditure which was budgeted for in 1994/95 but which in fact will actually occur in 1995/96, in fact prior to the commencement of next season.

As you are aware the Cricket Club and the Wantirna Football Club agreed to extend the veranda out from the Club rooms to give more shelter to players and supporters. The cost of this to the Cricket Club will be in the vicinity of \$3,500.

If you deduct this amount from the balance it takes the starting balance for 1995/96 down to around \$3,500. A balance that doesn't leave much room to manoeuvre.

It will therefore be paramount for subscriptions to be paid as early as possible.

This plea is reiterated each year yet there are people, usually the same ones, who leave it to the last possible moment to pay or make arrangements to pay over an extended time.

The Committee faced a number of difficulties this year in meeting its adopted budget:

- * it was budgeted that there would be two under 12 sides. Unfortunately, due to numbers this was reduced to one.
- * A larger number of junior players played senior cricket, which is great for the Club, but indicates that senior players were down compared to previous years.
- * Early in the season the Club lost the services of Nathan Small. Nathan had planned great things in the fund raising/social events as well as the canteen. Unfortunately we were unable to replace Nathan and many of the things he had planned did not proceed.

Thanks must go to Murray Parker who managed to keep the canteen operating and for organising a successful chocolate drive.

Next season will bring different challenges to the incoming Committee. It will be imperative for the Committee to continue to strive to build up financial reserve to meet major expenditure in the future. The cricket pitch covering at both Templeton and Milpera will have to be replaced in the next year or so and greater expenditure on equipment will also be required during this period.

Finally congratulations must to go to Murray and his Committee for a job well done. To meet all it's financial responsibilities whilst keeping subscriptions as low as they have been is a terrific effort. The low level of subscriptions may not be able to be maintained unless greater income is derived from social events, sponsors and other fund raising activities.
