## TREASURERS REPORT

The following 1995/96 Financial Statement has been prepared on an accrual basis whereby all costs associated with the 1995/96 financial year have been taken into account even though they may have been paid outside this period. In this way we can obtain a better picture of the results of the year and the position of the Club going into the new year.

Although the final balance appears quite healthy it is imperative for the Club to build up reserves to enable it to replace "capital" items such as cricket pitches, practice wickets, equipment etc.

Further, the Council has indicated that it is moving to a "user pays" basis of providing facilities for sporting clubs. This means that clubs, including Templeton C.C. will have to pay for such things as grass cutting and facility maintenance etc. This will add considerably to the cost of running the Club.

The Club unfortunately has not been all that successful in raising funds from social functions, major raffles, chocolate drives etc. It requires commitment from ALL members which hasn't been forthcoming over the last few years.

It is always better to raise funds from sources external to the Club however, where this is not possible the only option open is to raise funds from member's subscriptions.

During last season a review was done of the level of subscriptions of other clubs in the Knox area and it was evident that Templeton's was the lowest in nearly all instances. This has, of course, been the aim of the Committee. However, there comes a point where, without sufficient support in other areas of fund raising there is no option but to increase subscriptions.

At the Annual General Meeting a recommendation will be put to the members to raise the level of subscriptions.

Thanks must go to Paul Denton the Club's bar manager who did a tremendous job during the season. Proceeds from bar sales is the Clubs greatest source of income (apart from subscriptions) and its control and operation is imperative to the Club's overall success.

Also, it goes without saying that the Club is extremely fortunate to have a President such as Murray Parker. Murray is not only an active president but also janitor, canteen manger, scorer, marketing executive, public relations manager, etc , etc. It would nice to think that in future when Murray is emptying the bins or cleaning the canteen etc some members might offer to assist!

Finally many thanks to those members who attended social functions, sold raffle tickets and such like - maybe next season more members will do likewise.
