TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - 2007/2008

Season 2007/08 should be remembered as another successful one for the Templeton Cricket Club. The scoresheet might read only 1 premiership flag won by our Vets, but we finished the season strongly and have laid the foundations for more Templeton success in the seasons to come, in what will be an exciting next couple of years for the Taipans.

The season started off welcoming back to the club Ben Hanley, a former junior player who returned from the District cricket ranks to add extra batting strength to our 1's. With Ben's inclusion and the continuing improvement of Luke Robertson and Leigh Caulfield saw the 1's string 9 wins in a row (including knocking out Mooroolbark in the Preliminary Final) to march into the Chandler Grand Final against the Nth Ringwood Bulls. History tells us that we were beaten by the better team over the weekend but our boys can hold their heads up high and be proud of their efforts. Well led by Diso, again they did Templeton Cricket Club and its supporters extremely proud and enhanced our reputation in the RDCA as the strongest club in the competition – this was backed up by winning the RDCA Club Champion for the 2nd year in a row. A massive thanks to Steve Teakel on all his hard work preparing the boys and time spent at training and selection, his hard work has paid off again for the club. Also I would like to thank Steve's coaching crew of Robbo, Ben Hanley and Degga's for their efforts working with the boys in the nets and sharing some of your cricket expertise.

Our 2's lead the Newey Plate competition all season after a promotion from A grade the year before but stumbled at the critical time of the season. We saw some new faces break into a line up that has featured the same players of a few years which is encouraging for our future as we start to push these young blokes like Steve Dewar, Ryan Baker and Tim Lee up into the 1's in the seasons to come. Well done to Paul Taylor on his leadership in getting the boys to the finals again.

The boys in the 6's also did very well during the season considering we were struggling to field a team of adults the season before. Dean Morrison took the lead in getting some past players back to the club to play in this team which was well led by Wilbur, and they made the finals before bowing out in the preliminary final. It was great to see some old names back at the club during the year and I am hoping we can continue this format next season and welcome past players back to the club to enjoy their cricket again.

Our junior program is back on track and growing strongly thanks to Junior Co-ordinator Hayden Surrao, Junior Coach Chris Pantlin and the new breed of Taipan players and parents starting to make their way up into the club. This season we had 4 out of 5 junior sides play in the finals which is a fantastic effort by all the kids, thanks also to the parents involved in running the teams and getting the kids to training and to the games. It really is pleasing to see the club's depth in the juniors growing again along with our successful Milo program run by Sean Meehan and Paul Williams. But we need to keep working hard as a club on retaining and recruiting through our local schools with more clinics run by our senior players and mail outs to keep the community "in the know" as to what's happening at our club.

Doing things correctly now will ensure we get better at making sure we keep our kids playing cricket at Templeton and push up into the senior ranks in the next few years.

The club is moving into an exciting period, our senior club is strong with depth, our junior club is building stronger and the two are starting to come together as a whole. We have a sub-committee that has been holding meetings all year about extensions to Templeton clubrooms and up grade of facilities. For all this to continue and to go ahead we need people involved, putting there hand up to do a job at the club. It can be anything from being on the committee, or if you have not got the time maybe help in the canteen for an hour each Saturday. There are so many things that need to be done for you to enjoy the cricket club you have today. Next season will open a few opportunities for people to step up and lead the club into the future. Templeton Cricket Club has set a high standard but we need to keep working at doing things better and getting new people involved with new ideas to ensure we are around for the next 25 years.

I would like to congratulate Brett Keys and Dean Morrison on the work they did to organise the 25th Anniversary dinner in April. It was easily the best Templeton function I have ever been to and can't wait to see what is in store for the 30th year celebrations. Well done to all the award winners on the night especially Wendy Dewar who won the Presidents trophy, which was very well deserved after many years of quality service to Templeton.

I would like to thank my executive committee and non-executive members for their help whilst I have been President the last two years. Your support to me has been invaluable in what has been a very rewarding but at times demanding and stressful job. I have enjoyed the experience of running the club and have learned a lot having done it. Good luck to you all next season and I wish the club and you the best.

TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB
DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT - 2007/2008

The goal for the Templeton Cricket Club in season 2007/2008 was to ensure that the club progressed on and off the field during the season.

We had priorities to increase the Bank account balance each season to a level where we can look at long-term projects to improve our clubrooms. But this goal had to be balanced with looking after the general needs of the members during the season.

Financially, we recorded a loss of \$4037 which is a decrease of \$11009 from last season's profit with our Bank account balances decreasing to \$17899 from last season's \$25672.

How is this possible? This season we had a large number of anomalies, which as Director of Finance I have never encountered in a season before and I will explain them to you below.

The highlights for the season were the following:

1. A highly successful Super draw function that made a profit of \$9520 on the day, which is the highest ever result. Thank you to Brett Gibb and Jason Disney for another fantastic effort.
2. The canteen made a very good profit of \$3235. An excellent effort by Wendy Dewar in her last year and we would like to thank you for your tireless efforts over the years and for all the money that you have raised for the club.
3. Bar takings increased for the first time in 4 seasons by \$1834 from last season which was a good result considering a number of detrimental factors that included a faulty refrigerator, no regular bar manager and the theft of alcohol.
4. Subscriptions increased this season by \$1520 due to the increase of senior players in the lower grades.
5. Sponsorship increased this season to \$5000. Thank you to all of our sponsors for their generous support.

The lowlights/anomalies for the season were the following:

1. The break-in and theft of around 20 slabs, a number of bottles of spirits and the first aid kits cost the club approximately \$2500 in assets.
2. A fine of \$661 for breaching our liquor licence hours has put the club in a precarious position, as a further breach in at least the next 5 years will result in the loss of our liquor licence.
3. Our coaching and player payments due to the success of the ones and the appointment of a junior coach increased to \$11963 an increase of \$5485 from last season.
4. Our club merchandise spending increased by \$6860 due to low stocks the previous season and more emphasis by juniors to wear club wear as well as the cricket caps required for the anniversary dinner.
5. We received a grant last season to purchase first aid kits and we spent \$1400 in this cricket season to buy them, which inflated last season's profit.
6. This seasons Presentation night/Anniversary dinner resulted in a loss of \$1630 but \$1000 of this is a deposit paid to use the Novotel as the venue but was subsequently changed to the Karralyka Centre. The refund of this deposit is expected in the next few weeks.
7. A cost of \$1693 for framing Templetonian items was incurred last season but paid this season.

Notes

We purchased a new computer this season at an expense of \$3000 to assist the club in its day-to-day duties.

We also went halves at a cost of \$701 and purchased new tables and chairs for the clubrooms.

We also purchased and installed an alarm to safeguard our assets for the future.

Thank you everyone for your assistance.

Please find the following notes for the season and Financial Statements for 2007/2008. The asset amounts are at Executive Committee valuation as at 30th June 2008, and are considered conservative.

NOTES FORMING PART OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

INCOME

BAR

An increase in income of \$1834 from last season was pleasing, as this had been decreasing over the last few seasons. Success in the senior teams and the involvement of junior parents supported by the newly formed junior committee assisted in this result. It was great to see some new faces up at the club. We maintained our prices this season due to the purchase of the majority of our alcohol from Ritchies. Thanks to Tyson McCamley for his assistance. We need to have a permanent bar manager next season to ensure the bar runs smoothly.

CANTEEN

A lot of hard work by Wendy Dewar resulted in a profit of \$3235 a decrease of \$544 from last season. This is just down on last season's record profit result. This was Wendy Dewar's last season managing the canteen and we would like to thank you very much.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

The total of clothing sold was \$3496, which was an increase of \$1876 from last season due to the sales of cricket shirts, jackets and caps.

SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

We had a number of very successful functions with the attendances being mainly from the same people at all events. Thanks to those who helped with the organization of our functions. The anniversary dinner was a fantastic night for the club as everyone would agree. The gaming night wasn't conducted this year.

BUNNINGS BARBEQUE

We conducted 2 barbeques this season at Bayswater and Vermont South and they produced a profit of \$2093. Thanks to Brett Keys and Wendy Dewar for organizing these days and all of the players who assisted. All players had a lot of fun.

AFTERNOON TEA

We made a loss of \$1160 for the season, which was an increase of \$740 from the previous season. This was caused by a large number of home finals as well as the costs involved in making the afternoon teas, which increased, by \$460. This was Anne Tasevski's last season making the afternoon teas and we would like to thank you for your tireless efforts over the years. We will need to ensure this area is maintained at a high level with minimal cost changes next season.

DINNERS

No dinners were cooked this season. This initiative needs to be looked at as it worked well for both the players and the club last season.

DREAM TEAM

Well done to Adam DeJager again on organizing and collating the stats each week. It created a lot of interest and made players look at the scores and results of players in all teams.

BARBEQUE

We made a profit of \$79 for the season which was well down on last season. Thanks to Wendy Dewar for organizing the meat and bread and the players for cooking when required. The barbeque needs to be promoted and better maintained next season.

RAFFLES

A decrease of \$503, which is well down on last seasons excellent result.

PRE SEASON RAFFLE

A profit this season of \$455 which was down on last seasons profit of \$1333. This was due to the purchase of this year's prizes and a less number of tickets sold.

SPONSORSHIP

Thank you to all of our sponsors especially Damian Degenhardt at Effective Freight Management, Andrew Morris at CHN Herold Ross Chartered Accountants and Ian Garvey at Stuart Broadley and Associates.

TEMPLETONIANS

Was not conducted this season.

GRANTS

We received 4 grants this season and we allocated these funds to junior cricket equipment, junior clothing and first aid kits.

PRIZEMONEY

We received \$250 for participation in the VB 20/20 Cup.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

There was an increase in subscriptions of \$1520 from last season which was pleasing to see caused by more senior members playing in the 5ths and 6ths as well as diligent collecting in the juniors.

INTEREST

An increase of \$41 from last season.

EXPENSES

CRICKET BALLS

Expenditure decreased by \$335 this season. This was mainly due to the tighter control of the allocation of new balls by Steve Teakel.

COACHING

This amount consists of payments to our coach, junior coach and paid players and increased by \$5485 from last season. With the firsts making the grand final the players and coach have had a very successful season. This is a large increase over the last 2 seasons and the new committee will need to determine what amount they need to spend to achieve success.

EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

The purchase/ renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. This amount was higher this season by \$2096 due to our cricket gear purchases for the juniors and the fifths team.

GROUND FEES

An increase in fees of \$562 this season partly due to our extra sides.

RDCA

This seasons costs decreased by \$582 from the previous season as this was due to an extra \$300 being paid the year before.

INDOOR TRAINING

An increase in expenditure of \$280 from last season.

FIRST AID KITS

We purchased first aid kits from last seasons grant but these were subsequently stolen in the burglary at the club before we even used them. We have since purchased new first aid kits from another grant that we received late in the season but the grant didn't cover all of our costs.

UMPIRES - FINALS

A decrease of \$60 this season.

BAR

Expenditure increased by \$1989 for the season, which was in comparison to the increase in income as well. The major reason for the increase in expenditure was the theft of 20 slabs of alcohol consisting of beer and spirits and a number of bottles of spirits.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

A large increase of \$6860 this season as the majority of our stock was extremely low. Purchases consisted of cricket shirts, jackets, jumpers, cricket caps and hats. A large number of cricket caps were purchased for all players that had played in the firsts for the anniversary dinner.

CORDIAL

A new expense recorded to gauge how much we spend on this item.

AUCTION

Auction expenses this season were allocated to the actual function e.g. superdraw, presentation night or templetonians.

SOCIAL/FUNDRAISING

This includes payments for functions during the year. D'Js, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred in presenting functions for the players.

TEMPLETONIANS

This cost is framing for pictures that were sold last cricket season.

CLEANING

An increase in costs of \$200 this season. Thanks to Paul and Judy Denton for their efforts on a weekly basis. The clubrooms displayed a professional image to our members and visitors at all times.

TELEPHONE

A decrease in expenditure of \$80 from last season.

INSURANCE

An increase of \$321 this season due to our extra teams.

FINES

Due to our breach in our liquor licence late in the season we were fined \$661 by the licensing inspector at the Knox police station. We are on our final notice and any further breaches will result in the loss of our licence. We also received \$80 in fines from the RDCA.

SPONSORSHIP COSTS

This expense was badges for shirts for senior and junior players.

TROPHIES

An increase of \$362 from last season.

BANK CHARGES

The credit card merchant facility accrued charges of \$1034 from credit card spending of \$25113 up \$3192 from last season. There were 152 credit card transactions at an average of \$165 per transaction. The \$5 fee didn't cover our costs this season.

INTERNET

An increase of \$137 from last season.

WEBSITE

The cost of the maintenance of the website was increased by \$65 this season.

TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB COACHES REPORT - 2007/2008

With the club celebrating its 25th year of existence there was great expectation from the players and committee to make it a year to remember. The 2007/2008 season proved to be successful for the Templeton Cricket Club with three of the six teams participating in the final series and the First IX playing off in the Chandler One Grand Final. For the second year in a row we were rewarded with the RDCA Club Champion trophy, which reflected the strength and competitiveness of all six teams throughout the season

The coaching group of Travis Degenhardt, Luke Robertson under my guidance were charged with the responsibility of developing the playing group – individually and as a team – was further strengthened by the addition of Ben Hanley, a Templeton junior returning after a successful stint with Melbourne and Camberwell Magpies. Also thanks to Paul Taylor and Brett Gibb who assisted in the conduct of training and Stuart Murley who worked with the wicket keepers.

At the junior level the appointment of Chris Pantlin as the Junior Development Coach provided guidance and experience for his enthusiastic team of coaches and their developing and energetic players.

Thanks to Alan Gale and the Ringwood Cricket Club for providing an opportunity to play a practice match prior to the commencement of the season. No doubt it was our competitiveness that kept them in good stead as they went onto recording their first Premier cricket premiership this year. Templeton CC took part in the Cricket Victoria VB Twenty20 club championship which saw us victorious against Boronia CC but lost to Vermont CC.

During the year over 117 players represented the Templeton Cricket Club with the following players being recognised for their achievements:

- Luke Robertson - RDCA All Star team
- Travis Deganhardt - T20 game v Ringwood
- Adam Parker - Saxon Sports U21 player of the month

I am most appreciative of the support the captains provided throughout the year, their valuable input into selection and the way they guided their teams on the field. The first eleven under the captaincy of Jason Disney finished in third place at the end of the normal season, defeating Norwood in the semi final to face Mooroolbark the next week. An exceptional effort with the bat chasing over 300 was rewarded with a grand final berth against North Ringwood who proved too consistent with the bat and ball. Congratulations to Ben Hanley, Ian Garvey, Tim Lee and Andrew Teakel who all debuted with the First IX this season.

Having won the A grade premiership under the leadership of Paul Taylor, the Second IX were determined to be part of Newey Plate finals action this season. At the end of the home and away season they were sitting comfortably on top, but were not able to perform at a consistent level during their two finals matches. The exciting aspect of this team is that we have a number of players on the rise who will be looking to push for First IX selection in the coming seasons.

Scott Gibson took over the leadership of the Third IX and comfortably grew into the role throughout the year. His enthusiastic group of young cricketers had some memorable games and none better than away victories against Norwood and St. Andrews second elevens where they stuck to the basics - bowling and fielding their way to victory.

The Fourth IX team struggled for consistency with the bat for most of the year although they did put together some good performances to record two victories over Norwood who went onto play finals cricket. Thanks to Andrew Hathaway who lead the team well throughout the season.

Ryan Lane lead the Fifth IX which consisted a team of new players to the Templeton CC who worked hard on their skills and played with enthusiasm throughout the season to record three victories.

The "Super Sixes" saw the return of a number of past players who created their own special brand of cricket under the guidance of Paul Williams. They were successful in making the finals and played off in the preliminary final.

Thank you to Sam Bates, Jason Disney and the committee for your ongoing support in my role as senior coach of the Templeton Cricket Club.

TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB JUNIOR OPERATIONS REPORT - 2007/2008

Looking back on 2007/08 I think a lot was achieved throughout the year.

Right back at the start of the year I asked the players to fill out a sheet outlining some of their goals for the upcoming year. 35 players responded, and of these, 26 had playing finals as either their only goal or one of their goals. For four out of our five junior sides, this goal was achieved, and the 14-4's even managed to make it through to the grand final where they put in a huge effort but just came up short against a very good combined team from Boronia and Mooroolbark. Unfortunately, we couldn't come home with any premierships. Nevertheless this is a good building block to carry on with for next season, and the players have all now got some finals experience which will help them in the future with their cricket.

At the start of the year a junior handbook was given to the players to use throughout the year. In the handbook there was all the contact details needed, expectations and goals, playing guidelines for the different facets of the game (batting, bowling, fielding), stats and history of the club (both senior and junior) and a section for players to fill out with their own performances throughout the year. I hope the players found the handbook useful and helpful.

Perhaps for me one of the difficult parts of the job was that with my own cricket, it was very difficult to get to any games on a Saturday. If we were playing away it just wasn't possible, and if we were at home it was only possible to come down and stay to the tea break at the latest. Also with a casual part time job, occasionally I missed a training session as I couldn't get out of work. Whilst this was disappointing for me, I and the club knew this would be the case when taking on the job at the start of the year.

One of the most pleasing aspects for me through this year was the respect I was given by the players, team coaches and parents. It made the job a lot easier. Also the efforts and attitudes from players during games and at training were fantastic. It made my coaching role easier knowing that I could try new things or ask players to do something and they were keen to do it. The job was also made a lot easier with all the help that came from so many parents who volunteered. To all the team coaches – Andrew Teakel and Damien Murray (Under 16-2), Ian Garvey and Tim Lee (Under 14-2), Tony Naylor and Bruce Camm (Under 14-4), Ian Roberts (Under 12-2), Craig Henry and David Adam – team managers and parents who came to training, to games and helped out a very big thank you. Also Alan Shearer deserves some mention for his work as team manager. He was at every game, occasionally at training, and did a lot of work to help the under 16s.

Templeton is very lucky to have so many people helping out doing amazing work, but I think there are two people who need a special 'thank you'. The first is Ian Roberts, who did an excellent job of coaching the Under 12-2's team and looking after all the Under 12's at training on Wednesday nights. With four teams training on the one night it was difficult for me to get around to all the players, and at the start of the year I was asked to focus more on the under 16s and under 14s, which made it difficult to get to do much with the under 12s on a Wednesday night. When I did though, it was easy to see that Ian was doing a fantastic job and teaching them all the right things. So thank you very much Ian.

The biggest thank you must go to Hayden Surrao. Without Hayden's work the junior club wouldn't function. He is extremely hard-working and a brilliant organiser. I would hate to guess the amount of hours he has put in this year but it has been phenomenal. His commitment to the club and the people involved in it is a real credit to him. Well done Hayden.

I hope everyone enjoyed their season and got something out of it. Have a good break over winter and hopefully you will all be back to start another season with the mighty Taipans in September.
