Once again the canteen was a major source of funds for the club. Considering the canteen did not have a game at "home" until mid-November and we only had one week of finals. Wendy Dewar did this with a smile every week and as the financial statements show the canteen raised a significant amount of money. Here back to back "Best Clubman" award is well deserved. Thanks Wendy!!

To all the other people who helped out in the canteen and at social functions – I thank you. To Leslie Disney, Jo Harry, Sharon Dorshorst, Sharon Hough, Michelle Morrison, Erin Peterson, Jade Quinn, Brett Keys and anyone else I have forgotten - Thank you very much!!

Whilst we scaled back the usage of the website this year a huge thanks must go to Kate Meehan for her efforts here. We still have one of the best websites going around and now we have some cash reserves in the bank I am sure we will expand our usage of this.

The smell of the satays and schnitzels is part of the Taipan experience. To Nathan and Gail – thank you for your efforts – to put the club first on Saturday nights is something we all appreciate. I hope you continue to scream at the top of your voice and drink the scotch for many years to come!!

Financially the club had a solid year. A decision was made early last year to have a very conservative season. This involved being frugal with our spending and ensuring all the events and functions we undertook were managed in a way to ensure that we could not make a loss. At the end of the season we have in excess of \$6,000 dollars in the bank and this will be a solid start for the next committee.

After nearly 8 years the club has had some success in obtaining some grant funding. The following bodies have confirmed grant funding in the next few months:

Our net relocation project is in the current year budget and should go ahead before the commencement of the upcoming season. After the receipt of these grants the whole project should be done with no cost to the club – this is the ideal result. Thanks to Brett Keys and Stuart Murley for their help with this.

On the field we had a fantastic year.

Winning 4 premierships is just about as good as it gets – congratulations to all premiership players – enjoy the feeling as it does not come around that often – unless of course you play in the 5ths or the Under 14's – it is fairly regular for these sides!!

Jason Disney had a fantastic individual season. To be awarded the Captaincy of the RDCA All Star side and be the runner-up in the Bill Dean Medal is testament to this. Special mention to Paul Payne and Steve Johnston who were also selected in this side. I personally am very pleased that Jason led the club to its first ever Chandler Shield Premiership. Congratulations to the 2nds and 5ths also – to both Brett and Terry – a job well done!!

The Junior Taipans were once again stellar performers.

Special thanks must go to Ian Garvey. The maturity of a guy who has taken on the role for the first time was amazing – the juniors caused no issues this year and this is a reflection of the job that Ian did. Thanks also to the coaches and helpers of the various grades.

Personally, I would like to thank the retiring members of the committee – Paul, Sam, Dean, Adam and Lucas. I am sure these people will not be lost to the club – only lost to the meetings!! To the new members of the committee elected tonight – thanks for putting your hand up and I hope you find the role rewarding and a challenge.

TREASURERS REPORT SEASON 2003/2004

The goal for the Templeton Cricket Club in season 2003/2004 was to ensure the club progressed on and off the field during the season as well as making a small profit.

We did achieve the majority of our goals and financially we recorded a profit of \$5113.76 which is a \$1963.64 increase from last season with our Bank Account balances increasing to \$6509 from last season's \$1395.

The highlights/ lowlights for the season were the following:

1. Bar takings increased by \$5165.11 from last season which is a pleasing turnaround.
2. Sponsorship decreased by \$2476.00 this season. A different approach will be required next season.
3. A highly successful Super draw function that made a profit of \$4,935.00 on the day. Thank you to Jason Disney and Brett Gibb for another fantastic effort.
4. The canteen made a profit of \$2915.00. An excellent effort by Wendy Dewar.

TREASURERS REPORT- SEASON 2003/04

Notes forming part of the Financial Statements.

INCOME

BAR

An increase in income of \$5165.00 from last season is explained by the following factors. A busier social year due to larger attendance at social functions and more numbers on most Thursdays and Saturdays. Also the introduction of more happy hours and the on field success of the teams especially the firsts.

CANTEEN

A lot of hard work by Wendy Dewar resulted in a profit of \$2915.00 an increase of \$52 from last season. This is a great result considering we didn't play at Templeton for the first 6 weeks of the season and we didn't receive a grand final at Templeton.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

This is the money received from players as payment for Club merchandise. This amount is higher than expenses as we purchased minimal stock this season.

AFTERNOON TEA

We made a profit of \$391.00 for the season. Thank you to Anne Tasevski for her fantastic efforts.

SPONSORSHIP

We had very minimal sponsorship this season.

SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

We had a number of very successful functions with good attendances at all events. Thanks to Sam Bates and his helpers for organizing these functions. Thank you to Dean Gascoyne for organizing the Matrix function in November for the juniors and seniors and making a profit of \$298.00. I hope this function will be an annual event. The social levy worked well with approximately 80% of players using their free admittance to most social functions.

BARBEQUE

We made a profit of \$40 for the season. Thank you to Nathan Small for his hard work.

FUNDRAISING

An increase in income of \$1175 from last season with an overall profit of \$3515. Raffles, pinball machine, joker poker and Ritchies were very similar to last season. The increase was due to the pre-season raffle earning the club \$1251 from our free slabs of beer. An excellent effort.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

A decrease of \$913 from the previous season is due to the losing of our one-day side. The junior subs were increased this season but subscriptions fell due to the drop of players in the juniors.

EXPENSES

CRICKET BALLS

Expenditure decreased \$651 due to the reduction in teams in the seniors and juniors.

BANK CHARGES

The credit card merchant facility accrued charges of \$488.00 from credit card spending of \$10,803.00. Government charges of \$85.00 were incurred for the season.

EQUIPMENT

The purchase/ renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. This year expenditure was only \$155.00. The club has organized to improve the kits for next season.

BAR

Expenditure increased by \$2750.00 during the season which was in comparison to the increase in income.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

A decrease of \$3,036 this season due to our previous stock on hand. We will need to purchase stock for the forthcoming season.

COACHING

This amount consists of payments to our paid players and increased by \$3,849 from last season but was equal to our budget estimates and we achieved our goal of a premiership.

GROUND FEES

Decrease in fees of \$363 due to the non-playing of the club at Templeton Reserve in October and part of November.

RDCA

Decrease in costs of \$264.00 for the year. An excellent effort by all concerned with only a few minor fees for the year.

SOCIAL/FUNDRAISING

This includes payments for functions during the year. D'Js, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred in presenting functions for the players. The auction costs are purchases for an auction next season.

TELEPHONE

A decrease of \$107.00 from last season.

TROPHIES

An increase of \$951.00 from last season due to the 4 premierships we won in the seniors and juniors. This is one expense we don't mind having.

INDOOR TRAINING

A decrease of \$140 from the previous season.

UMPIRES/FINALS

Payment of umpires for Junior Grand Finals.

CLEANING

An increase of \$784.00 this season due to the use of a professional cleaner on a weekly basis. The cleaner worked longer hours and on a higher hourly rate this season. The clubrooms display a professional image to our members and visitors.

INSURANCE

A decrease of \$651.00 due to the change in the type of insurance cover.

WEBSITE

The cost of the maintenance of the website.

REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

This expense was for the repair and installation of a new motor for the kitchen refrigerator.

Some fine batting performances from Andy Morris, Neil, Cat and Murray also got us over the line in a few games. My congratulations to the firsts, seconds and fifths for winning their flags, its great that we now have a Chandler 1 flag – well done boys!

Finally, special thanks to Murray and Neil in particular for assisting with the captaincy and team during the year and I hope that they both play again next season – when we will get to the finals again – and this time – WIN!!!
