President's Report

Season 2023/24 was significant in the history of the Templeton Cricket Club being our 40th Anniversary.

Our Club can be extremely proud of what we have achieved since its inception in 1983. Significantly during this period, we have provided 1385 players with the opportunity to play cricket and be a part of the exceptional TCC community. Other measures that can be used to tell our 40-year journey include:

- 27 Life Members
- 9 players that have played 300 games Jason Denton, Simon Denton, Brett Keys, Jason Disney, Paul Williams, Steve Tasevski, Sean Meehan, Andrew Hathaway & Arron Vinen
- 4 Club Legends Paul Denton, Jason Disney, Brett Keys & Sean Meehan
- 4 players who have represent Victoria Josh Hudson, Jackson Edwards & Alexander Meehan
- 1 RDCA Hall of Fame inductee Jason Disney
- 1 player who have represented Australia at test cricketer Peter Handscomb

To celebrate this milestone, our 40th Anniversary Function was held in October and proved to be a highlight of the year with over 200 guests in attendance including a significant number of former players and life members. Whilst there were many memorable moments during the evening, a particular highlight was a video that detailed the creation of our Club which featured Paul Denton, John Cassidy, Paul Owen, Norm Barnfield, Murray Parker and the inaugural President Russel Lindroth. I hope that those who played a key role in the establishment of our great Club feel a sense of accomplishment and personal pride. Another highlight was the presentation of 40th Anniversary Life Member medallions to 23 of our Life Members. Many hours of planning and preparation went into making the function a great success – thank you to Paul Denton, Brett Keys, Paul Taylor, Arron Vinen and Dean Morrison for their substantial contributions over many months leading into the night.

Another significant moment during the year was for our Club to be recognised as the Knox Council Club of the Year award for 2022/23. This great achievement is the result of the significant contributions of many including all our junior & senior players, our parents who coach and manage our junior teams, volunteers, senior coaching staff, supporters, sponsors, past players and committee. Thanks to all of you for making our club an award winner!

On field, the highlight of the season was undoubtedly the premiership win by our Second XI in the Ian Spencer Shield. Superbly led by Andrew Gottliebsen, it was significant for the future of the Club that this team included many younger players who have progressed from our junior program. And whilst our Third XI did not end up achieving the ultimate success, being defeated in a close grand final, they should be proud of their achievements. The Club continues to be encouraged by the number of promising, young players who are playing regular senior cricket. We will continue to develop this player cohort and do all that we can to accelerate their development.

Our promising future was also exemplified by the Under 12-1 and Under 16-2 premierships. Congratulations to all the players who featured in these teams and the coaches and team managers for their guidance and support during the season.

It would also be remiss of me not to highlight the great individual recognition of a couple of our young players by the RDCA – congratulations to Jackson Edwards (Bill Dean Memorial Trophy Best Player Leaving Under 16s & Sean Flynn U/16 All Stars Team 2023/24) and Seb Pascoe (Sean Flynn U/16 All Stars Team 2023/24) for these outstanding achievements. We all look forward to watching your cricket journeys over coming years.

A key reason for the continued development of our young playing list is the efforts and commitment of our senior coaching group that was led by Club Senior Coach Andrew Gottliebsen with significant support from Paul Payne and Luke Cosgrove. I thank them for their considerable efforts in what was a challenging season without practice facilities for an extended period.

As noted, we are fortunate heading into the season to have new cricket practice nets at Templeton Reserve, which will provide players with a significantly improved facility to improve their skills. Due to a delay in their completion, it made for a difficult season from a training perspective and with the need to spread the playing group across multiple venues, hindered our ability to come together as one playing group. I thank all players who, despite some justified frustrations, accepted the predicament and got on with the task of training. This period also made it significantly challenging for our coaching group to work with players and implement coaching plans – thank you for your persistence during this frustrating time.

I also wanted to congratulate Andrew Gottliebsen on his induction as a Life Member of the Templeton Cricket Club. Andrew has made a significant contribution to our Club as a player (132 games, 1394 runs, 184 wickets & Member of our 2003/04 Chandler Shield premiership team) and off field as Club Coach & Chairman of Selectors since 2019/20.

One particularly sad moment for our Club community during the season was the passing of Ian "Colonel" Wood. The Colonel was a true gentleman who was passionate about the game of cricket and will be remembered as a wily spin bowler who challenged batsmen with his ability to flight a delivery and get it to turn at right angles. Ian was a member of our 2007/08 and 2009/10 Veterans premiership teams. Off the field, he was an active volunteer who worked as a property steward and painted the creases each week. Such was Ian's impact upon the Club, that our practice nets are named after him.

During the season, every player was given the opportunity to explore different roles and positions within the team, further developing their leadership skills, understanding of game strategy and taking responsibility for their decisions and learning from their experience, which is an important part of building their confidence. Players were not told what to do, rather guided and encouraged to experiment and further develop their understanding of the game, as the top U12 team in 2023-24, representing TCC.

The team played a total of 13 games during the season, including the semi-final and grand-final games. Unfortunately, the game against Warrandyte was abandoned due to bad weather, in a game that our team was leading by a big margin (TCC 4/141 vs Warrandyte 4/71). Our boys lost five games during the season including an unexpected loss against the lowest ranking team, Warranwood by 7 wickets in round 5. Losing to Warranwood was a great learning experience for the players to reflect on areas for improvement and build resilience. It was a well-balanced competition with most teams performing well, keeping their hopes alive to make finals. As the U12-1 grade was very competitive, it presented many challenges to progress up the leaderboard.

After losing the R11 game to North Ringwood, our chance of moving into semi-finals was hanging in the balance, as either quotient or run rate appeared to be the likely determining factor to make it to the top 4 positions. However, in R12, the team came back stronger than ever to defeat Heatherdale, progressing to semi-finals and securing 4th place on the ladder. Our semi-final (away game) was against the top ranked team - Heatherdale, which we won by 1 wicket in a close game.

We were fortunate to witness one of the greatest junior grand finals, playing against Mitchem. After winning the toss Templeton elected to bowl first. However, the weather was not on our side, and bad light was declared in the second split of the game. Although bad light was discussed on the 16th over, as outgoing batters said they had trouble seeing the ball , umpires decided to continue for another couple overs, which resulted in Templeton losing 5 wickets on day 1, still trailing by 33 runs at the close of day 1.

Going into the 2nd day and batting first, our biggest challenge was to get the players in the right mindset that they were still in the game. We scored a total of 98 runs, leading only by

25 runs. Mitcham only required 26 runs off 23 overs with 6 wickets in hand to win the grand final. It appeared to be an easy target to chase.

However, our team approached the game with determination and can-do attitude, taking all remaining wickets in quick succession. It only took the boys 5.5 overs to get Mitcham all out for 82 runs. This game was one of the greatest comebacks of the season, where our team demonstrated resilience, maturity to re-group and perfect execution. I have no doubt the boys will use this experience to hone their skills as they continue to improve their game.

Winning a grand final was a dream come true for many players, parents, grandparents, coach, TM and the club. Most players were fortunate to win two back-to-back grand finals, who were part of the U12/3 team in the 2022/23 season. I am so humbled that I had the opportunity to be the coach of many players on this team over the past 6 years, since they started playing cricket at the club.

Throughout the season, every player improved vastly, and developed their understanding of the game. Many players also took a keen interest in specialising in areas like spin bowling, wicket keeping etc. which was an outstanding outcome. Most importantly they developed great friendships, encouraged one another, and played as a team. They celebrated every wicket, every catch, good fielding and of course celebrated their wins with so much enthusiasm, energy and a smile on their faces, which was a delight to witness.

Reflecting on some of the outstanding individual performances, Hamish McLean winning Coaches award, Rhys Disney making a great contribution with his consistent performance with the ball and in the field and his magical hat-trick, Krish Kothare winning Batting and all-rounder award with outstanding performance was a testament to how they have developed and matured over the past few years. Fergus Gibson was fantastic behind the wicket and played a key role during the season. All other players contributed immensely to the success of the season earning the well-deserved grand final win.

Also throughout the season, Alice and I received fantastic support from parents both on and off the field, be it during the training sessions or on the game days. They certainly made my job as coach easier and enjoyable. Special thanks to Nathan Beswick for stepping in to assist with coaching duties with no hesitation.

I want to acknowledge the wonderful support from the TCC officials; Kristi, Esky ,Sean, and the broader team throughout the season, and without your involvement, this wouldn't have been possible. I congratulate the team on their premiership and the individual award winners for their outstanding performances.
