DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT SEASON 2008/2009

The goal for the Templeton Cricket Club in season 2008/2009 was to ensure that the club progressed on and off the field during the season.

We have priorities to increase the Bank account balance each season to a level where we can look at long-term projects to improve our clubrooms. But this goal has to be balanced with us looking after the general needs of the members during the season.

Financially, we recorded a profit of \$6453, which is a turnaround of \$10490 from last season's loss with our Bank account balances increasing to \$18989.

The highlights for the season were the following:

1. A highly successful Super draw function that made a profit of \$9157 on the day, which is another amazing result. Thank you to Brett Gibb and Jason Disney for another fantastic effort and I hope this wasn't Brett's last year.
2. The canteen made a very good profit of \$2431. An excellent effort by Anne Gottliebsen in running the canteen with some help from the junior mothers.
3. Subscriptions increased this season by \$1010 due to the increase of senior players in the lower grades.
4. Sponsorship increased this season to \$6500. Thank you to all of our sponsors for their generous support.
5. This year Anne Gottliebsen organized dinners on Thursday and Saturday nights and these dinners made a profit of \$2491.
6. We received after much effort the \$1000 deposit we paid last season to the Novotel for our proposed Presentation night there but subsequently cancelled.
7. The cricket club donated \$1000 to the Bushfire appeal

Notes

We purchased a new laptop this season at an expense of \$1400 to assist the club in its day-to-day duties.

We also went halves at a cost of \$1631 and purchased the Entertainment Unit for the clubrooms and a new fridge for Milpera at a cost \$640.

We also had a pitch replaced at a cost of \$2171.

NOTES FORMING PART OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

INCOME

BAR

A decrease in income of \$1380 from last season was back to our result of 2 seasons ago. Our level of income in this area sits between \$30k - \$33k each year and can't be relied on to support the clubs finances. We maintained our prices this season as much as we could but we rarely used kegs. Thanks to Paul Denton for his assistance.

CANTEEN

A lot of hard work by Anne Gottliebsen resulted in a profit of \$2431 a decrease of \$804 from last season. This is down on last season's record profit result.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

The total dollar value of clothing sold was \$2198, which was a decrease of \$1298 from last season.

SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

We had a number of very successful functions with the attendances being mainly from the same people at all events. Thanks to those who helped with the organization of our functions. The Greyhound night was a new night for the club and was a success.

AFTERNOON TEA

We made a loss of \$127 for the season, which was a decrease of \$1033 from the previous season. With Anne Gottliebsen taking over the making of the afternoon teas this season she changed the way the afternoon teas were made with minimal difference in the standard of the food and at a good cost saving.

DINNERS

The dinners on Thursday and Saturday nights this year were great and were well appreciated by the players and spectators. We raised \$3760 with a profit of \$2491. Thanks to Anne Gottliebsen for all of her hard work and to the players for cooking on Saturdays.

BARBEQUE

We made a profit of \$142 for the season. The barbeque was replaced for the majority of the season by the Saturday dinners.

RAFFLES

A decrease of \$465, which is well down on last seasons result and down \$968 from 2 seasons ago.

PRE SEASON RAFFLE

No Pre season raffle was conducted this year.

SPONSORSHIP

Thank you to all of our sponsors especially Damian Degenhardt at Effective Freight Management, Andrew Morris at CHN Herold Ross Chartered Accountants, Ian Garvey at Stuart Broadley and Associates, Simon Denton at Port Melbourne Containers, Plum Heating & Cooling and Craig Henry at South Melbourne TAB Agency.

GRANT

We received one grant this season of \$600 to replace our stolen first aid kit from the previous season.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

There was an increase in subscriptions of \$1010 from last season which was pleasing to see caused by more senior members playing in the 5ths and 6ths as well as diligent collecting in the juniors.

INTEREST

A decrease of \$106 from last season.

EXPENSES

CRICKET BALLS

Expenditure increased by \$1929 this season. This is one area we need to look at prior to the season starting, as we need to reduce this cost back to the previous season.

COACHING

This amount consists of payments to our coach, paid players and scorer and decreased by \$1486 from last season. The coaching payments for next season will vary again with the appointment of a new senior coach and with players changing in the firsts.

EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

The purchase/ renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. This amount was lower this season by \$1050 as we purchased more gear the previous season.

GROUND FEES

A decrease in fees of \$464 this season due to the limited use of Schultz Reserve.

RDCA

This seasons costs decreased by \$342 from the previous season.

INDOOR TRAINING

An increase in expenditure of \$150 from last season with a loss of \$2028 overall. We need to reduce this loss this season with a higher collection of training money or less net times or lanes.

UMPIRES - FINALS

An increase of \$40 this season.

BAR

Expenditure decreased by \$2920 for the season, which was in comparison to the decrease in income as well. The major reason for the decrease in expenditure was the theft of 20 slabs of alcohol consisting of beer and spirits and a number of bottles of spirits last season as well as the reduced costs of soft drinks and chips as they were mainly sold from the canteen. Beer gas costs were up by \$509 due to the increase cost of rentals.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

A large decrease of \$5853 this season as the majority of our stock was purchased last season and a large number of cricket caps were purchased for all players that had played in the firsts for the anniversary dinner.

CORDIAL

Was a very similar cost to last season.

AUCTION

Auction expenses this season were allocated to the actual function e.g. superdraw and presentation night.

SOCIAL/FUNDRAISING

This includes payments for functions during the year. D'Js, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred in presenting functions for the players.

BUSHFIRE DONATIONS

We collected \$2879 from players and friends wishing to donate to the bushfire appeal and the cricket club donated \$1000 as well. Total Donation was \$3879.

CLEANING

A decrease in costs of \$242 this season. Thanks to Paul and Judy Denton for their efforts on a weekly basis. The clubrooms displayed a professional image to our members and visitors at all times.

TELEPHONE

An increase in expenditure of \$18 from last season.

INSURANCE

A reduction of \$297 this season.

FINES

This season our fines from the RDCA were up to \$230 from last seasons \$80. Last season we incurred a fine of \$661 due to our breach in our liquor licence by the licensing inspector at the Knox police station. We are on our final notice and any further breaches will result in the loss of our licence.

TROPHIES

An increase of \$1066 from last season mainly due to the purchase of the Legends Award.

BANK CHARGES

The credit card merchant facility accrued charges of \$584 a reduction of \$450 from the previous season due to a decrease in the amount spent. With the introduction of the Eftpos machine we had credit card spending of \$16994 down \$8119 from last season. There were 242 credit card transactions at an average of \$70 per transaction down from last season's average of \$165.

STATIONERY

An increase in costs of \$195 this season.

INTERNET

A decrease of \$95 from last season.

WEBSITE

The cost of the maintenance of the website decreased by \$19 this season.

WIRELESS

With the introduction of a Laptop this season we had wireless setup and ongoing costs totalling \$302.

Club Coaches Report – Steve Teakel

Congratulations to the captains and players who represented the Templeton Cricket Club this year on a significant achievement of winning the RDCA Club Champion trophy for the third successive season. This reflects the continual improvement of many players and competitiveness of the six senior teams.

The 2008/2009 season proved to be successful for the club with four of the six teams participating in the final series. Well done to Adam De Jager and the Third IX who played very good finals cricket to capture the B Grade premiership. The club will now be represented in Chandler, Newey and A Grade – an exciting challenge for the club in the coming seasons.

During the year over 120 players represented the Templeton Cricket Club with the following players being recognised at the RDCA level for their achievements:

- Stuart Welsh – Chandler Batting award, RDCA All Star team, T20 game v Ringwood
- Andrew Gottliebse - Chandler Bowling Award, RDCA All Star team, T20 game v Ringwood
- Ben Hanley – T20 game v Ringwood
- Terry Rowe – I Grade Batting award

I am most appreciative of the support the captains provided throughout the year, with their valuable input into selection, commitment to the game plan and their leadership on the field. Special thanks to Ben Hanley for leading the Taipans during the RDCA 20/20 and for his assistance along with Luke Robertson at training.

The first eleven under the captaincy of Jason Disney finished in fourth place at the end of the season, defeated by North Ringwood in the elimination semi final. Unfortunately our batting performances continued to put enormous pressure on our bowling and fielding as we lost to teams who were not in finals contention. Congratulations to Ryan Dennis, Ryan Baker and Matt Weerden who all made their debut with the First IX this season.

For the second successive season the Second IX enjoyed Newey Plate finals action despite a slow start to the season. Stuart Simpson did an excellent job moulding the young team into a very competitive unit resulting in a comprehensive semi final win over North Ringwood and a rain affected loss to eventual premiers Chirnside Park. With continued development many of the younger players will be looking to be permanent members for the First IX in the coming seasons.

The Third XI has continued to rise up the grades over the past three seasons – moving from C Grade to A Grade. With Adam De Jager leading from the front the team took all before them defeating South Warrandyte second eleven in the grand final. During the finals the team had some significant performances including Brent McIlroy's 95 in the semi final, and Haran Ganagtharan's six wickets in the preliminary final and backed up with another half dozen in the grand final to gain him the man of the match award. The team stuck to the basics – building partnerships under pressure and then bowling and fielding their way to victory.

The Fourth XI team struggled for consistency throughout the season with the bat although they did put together some good performances to record a late season win over runners up Wonga Park and victories over a number of third eleven teams. A number of junior players – Matthew Shearer, Harry Exton and Rowan Calladine continued their cricketing development in this team and will be looking to move up the grades in the coming season. Thanks to Kevin Moore who captained the team well throughout the season.

The Malcolm Calladine led Fifth XI registered five wins and with the introduction of a number of new players to the Templeton CC worked hard on their skills and played with enthusiasm throughout the season. Significant victories against Olinda, Ainslie Park and Chirnside Park were highlights of the season.

The "Super Sixes" under the guidance of Paul Williams, commenced the season with a forfeit due to the lack of numbers - then had over 40 players represent the team - scraped into the finals with a victory in the final game of the year. Unfortunately their effort with the bat let them down and they lost to the eventual premiers Bayswater Park.

Congratulations to Nathan Owen on his appointment as the Templeton CC Coach and best wishes in for season 2009/2010.

I would like to thank the players, captains, Brett Keys and San Bates and their committees who have supported me as club coach over the past five seasons – it has been an exciting role working with a range of players, developing playing guidelines to support the development of individuals and teams, and building on field leadership throughout the club.

3rd XI captains report.
