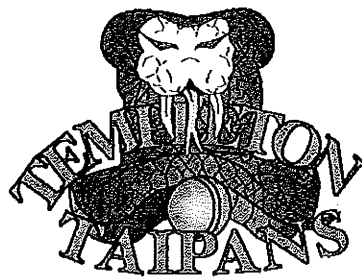

## **TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT – 2006/2007**

The goal for the Templeton Cricket Club in season 2006/2007 was to ensure the club progressed on and off the field during the season. We had priorities to stabilize or increase the Bank account balance to a level where we can successfully run the club as well as looking to spend our funds on improving our facilities in the next few seasons.

Financially, we recorded a profit of \$15046 which is a \$389 increase from last season with our Bank account balances increasing to \$25672 from last season's \$11542.

The highlights/ lowlights for the season were the following:

1. A highly successful Super draw function that made a profit of \$7310 on the day, which is the highest ever. Thank you to Jason Disney and Brett Gibb for another fantastic effort.
2. The canteen made a record profit of \$3862. An excellent effort by Wendy Dewar.
3. Templetonians was highly successful this season with an auction incorporated this year with the Rodney Hogg day and made a profit of \$2825. Thanks to Dean Morrison, Brett Keys and Jason Disney for your efforts.
4. Bar takings decreased by \$704 from last season which was a disappointing result for the third season in a row.
5. Subscriptions decreased this season by \$2782 due to the lack of senior players in the lower grades.
6. We received a grant of \$2959 in June this season. These funds will be spent early next season on first aid kits and shade equipment.

### **Notes**

We will be receiving a grant of \$1000 in July 2007 for spending on junior cricket shirts.  
We have sold \$1950 in auction items, which players will pay for, in the next few months.  
These funds are for Templetonians and presentation night.

## **NOTES FORMING PART OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

### **INCOME**

#### **BAR**

A decrease in income of \$704 from last season is explained by the lack of numbers on Thursday and Saturday nights. We had to maintain our prices this season and later in the year we dropped some of our prices due to the purchase of our alcohol from Ritchies. Thanks to Tyson McCamley for his assistance.

#### **CANTEEN**

A lot of hard work by Wendy Dewar resulted in a profit of \$3862 an increase of \$861 from last season. This is the best profit result we have had in the canteen ever. Those hot dogs must be good.

#### **CLUB MERCHANDISE**

The total of clothing sold was \$1620, which was a decrease of \$1141 from last season due to the initial purchase of cricket shirts last season.

#### **SOCIAL FUNCTIONS**

We had a number of very successful functions with the attendances being mainly from the same people at all events. Thanks to those who helped with the organization of our functions. The presentation night was a fantastic night for the club. The gaming and trivia nights were good profit functions for the club.

#### **BUNNINGS BARBEQUE**

We conducted 2 barbeques this season at Bayswater and Vermont South and they produced a profit of \$1390. Thanks to Brett Keys and Wendy Dewar for organizing these days and all of the players who assisted. All players had a lot of fun.

#### **AFTERNOON TEA**

We made a loss of \$420 for the season, which was a \$1030 turnaround from the previous season but the same as two seasons ago. This was caused by a lack of senior players in the lower grades and some players only playing a small number of games. I believe the afternoon tea levy is the best way to collect the payments. Thank you to Anne Tasevski for her fantastic efforts.

#### **DINNERS**

These are funds collected on Thursday nights from the player meals. Well done to Adam DeJager, Matt DeJager, Hayden Surrao and helpers on organizing this great new initiative for the players.

#### **DREAM TEAM**

Well done to Adam DeJager on organizing and collating the stats each week. It created a lot of interest and made players look at the scores and results of players in all teams.

#### **BARBEQUE**

We made a profit of \$359 for the season. Thanks to Wendy Dewar for organizing the meat and bread and the players for cooking each week.

## RAFFLES

An increase of \$1154 from last season. Thanks to Scott Gibson for his efforts.

## PRE SEASON RAFFLE

A good effort with an increase of \$356 from last season.

## SPONSORSHIP

Thank you to all of our sponsors especially Andrew Morris at CHN Herold Ross Chartered Accountants, X Inc Mortgage Brokers, Michelle at King Club Hair & Beauty Design and all of the players sponsors.

## TEMPLETONIANS

The third season this group has been introduced to the club. They hosted a day with Rodney Hogg coupled with an auction of sports memorabilia Templetonians made a profit of \$2825 a decrease of \$3968 from last season but the Rodney Hogg day was funded from last season's profits. Thanks to Brett Keys, Dean Morrison and Jason Disney for all of your efforts.

## GRANTS

We received a \$2959 grant for first aid kits and shade equipment e.g. umbrellas which will be spent early next cricket season. Thanks to Dean Morrison for his efforts.

## SUBSCRIPTIONS

There was a decrease in subscriptions of \$2782 from last season but only \$682 less than 2 seasons ago. Lack of senior players in the lower grades contributed heavily to this as we played a large number of juniors.

## INTEREST

An increase of \$79 from last season.

## **EXPENSES**

### CRICKET BALLS

Expenditure increased by \$781 this season.

### COACHING

This amount consists of payments to our coach and paid players and decreased by \$2171 from last season. This season was less than our budget estimates.

### EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

The purchase/ renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. This amount was very low due to our cricket gear purchases in the previous two seasons. We need to upgrade our cricket kits this season for seniors and juniors.

### GROUND FEES

A decrease in fees of \$34 this year.

### RDCA

The costs from last season increased by \$545, as \$300 was a RDCA expense from the previous season and more importantly our fines decreased this year to \$20.

### INDOOR TRAINING

An increase in expenditure of \$1075 from last season due to a change in venue, higher prices and the extra use by the seniors.

#### FIRST AID KITS

We purchased 4 small first aid kits for the junior teams to keep in their team kits.

#### UMPIRES - FINALS

An increase by \$280 due to our senior teams success in reaching the Grand Final.

#### HONOUR BOARD

An update of the honor board this season.

#### BAR

Expenditure decreased by \$583 for the season, which was in comparison to the decrease in income. This amount included a cost of \$622 to repair and clean the beer lines prior to the season starting.

#### CLUB MERCHANDISE

A large decrease of \$4281 this season as the majority of our stock was purchased last season.

#### AUCTION

Auction expenses consisting of purchasing auction items and the framing of them.

#### SOCIAL/FUNDRAISING

This includes payments for functions during the year. D'Js, raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred in presenting functions for the players.

#### CLEANING

An increase in costs of \$166 this season. Thanks to Paul and Judy Denton for their efforts on a weekly basis. The clubrooms displayed a professional image to our members and visitors at all times.

#### TELEPHONE

A decrease in expenditure of \$50 from last season.

#### INSURANCE

A decrease of \$244 this season.

#### TROPHIES

An increase of \$556 from last season due to the success of the seniors with premierships.

#### CANTEEN FRIDGE

The cost of purchasing a new fridge in the canteen in conjunction with the football club.

#### BANK CHARGES

The credit card merchant facility accrued charges of \$836 from credit card spending of \$21,921 up \$1,956 from last season. There were 166 credit card transactions at an average of \$132 per transaction. The \$5 fee covered our costs this season.

#### INTERNET

An increase of \$150 from last season.

#### WEBSITE

The cost of the maintenance of the website was increased by \$85 this season.

Under a RDCA restructuring of the grades the second eleven found themselves in A grade under the leadership of Paul Taylor and were determined to be part of the Newey action next season. At the end of the home and away season they were sitting comfortably on top but were challenged by Wantirna South in the grand final. A match winning performance with the ball by Scott Anderson and determined batting by Tim Aumann and Ian Garvey gave the team a well deserved but nail biting victory.

## **TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB**

### **2<sup>ND</sup> XI CAPTAINS REPORT – 2006/2007**

Firstly, I would like to congratulate all members of the club on winning the RDCA Club championship. This is a prestigious award to win and I believe for only the second time, which I find hard to believe considering how strong we have been throughout the grades since our existence so well done to all and keep up the good work.

To Diso and Gassy, well done on making it to the finals. With the depth we have and some potential big signings on the cards, the future looks bright with more flags on the way. Congratulations to Adam and his side for winning the C grade flag. Fantastic achievement considering how close you have come to winning the flag in previous years. To Steve Teakel, as far as I can remember, we have never had a coach at the club who puts in as much time and effort as you do. Everything you have done has improved how we all approach and play the game. You are the main reason why we won the Club Championship so thanks for everything.

At the start of the season, the RDCA decided to change the grading format and we found ourselves in A grade. The season started in a positive vein as we won our first 4 games without any problems. Our first loss was to our archrival in Wantirna South in a one-day international, losing by 6 runs. This was extremely disappointing as we failed to chase a low score, but to the guys credit we put that game behind us and won every other home & away game for the remainder of the season.

We played Kilsyth at the Taipan Pit, which was by far our best batting performance for the year. We chased down 224 in a stinking 39 degrees just before tea. We batted the remainder of the overs out and broke the World Record Score at Templeton Reserve scoring 436. The highlight of the day was JD's 136 in the extreme heat. It was a gutsy knock and he did us all proud. Besides winning flags, there is nothing better as a captain than seeing one of your team mates perform the way JD did in the heat.

Another highlight was when we played Chirnside Park at Black Panther HQ in a one dayer. We bowled first, took a wicket on the second ball of the day and then steamrolled them for 34 runs from 15 overs, extras being the equal top score with 10. Tim "Chubbs" Aumann was a man on a mission taking 7 for 13 from his 8 overs. He bowled an absolute treat and I rate his spell one of the best I have seen.

We completed the season 16 points clear on top of the ladder with 12 wins, 1 loss and one washout. Our percentage was more than twice the amount of most sides in the comp and in some cases; 3 times more than other sides so overall we dominated the home & away fixture.

game for us with his family watching was awesome. He certainly stuck it up all the South blokes giving it to him from the boundary line.

Playing Wantirna South in the Grand Final, we played at a very lush Scoresby Ground on a cold day where we lost the toss and they had a hit first. We were into our 4<sup>th</sup> over of the day when showers swept across the ground and dumped rain on us for the next 2 hours. We resumed play just before 4 pm with Scott Anderson making an immediate impact by finding the edge of the two openers with some great catching at 2<sup>nd</sup> Slip by Brett Gibb.

The boys slowly put more and more pressure on the Wantirna South Batsmen who were struggling to put a decent partnership together because of the steady fall of wickets. Some even greater catching by Arron Vinen behind the stumps allowed Ando to take his 7<sup>th</sup> wicket of the game and bowled an absolute treat. Garvs came on kept it tight from his end and chipped in for 2 wickets and Bater finished off the tail as usual collecting the last wicket and Wantirna South were all out for 104.

Scott Anderson played the game of his life taking 7-35 and also taking 2 catches. It doesn't get any better than that in the biggest game of the year!. Our first game was at home to Bayswater Park, they elected to bat and were soon in trouble by the 7<sup>th</sup> over [2-16]; a couple of 20 run partnerships before a middle order collapse had them 6 –67; some spirited resistance by their no 11 enabled them to reach 103. We got off to a solid start from BROOKY and MURRY P. before both went out with the score around 40, another 20 runs and two more wickets fell but SKEETER [ 21\*] held the innings together and we passed them with 6 down in the 33<sup>rd</sup> over.

## **TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB UNDER 12'4S TEAM REPORT – 2006/2007**

### **Season Overview**

The 2006 / 07 season was an amazing challenge yet immensely rewarding experience for the boys in the 12 4's. The season started off on rocky grounds with only 7 kids at the first game and with the quick formation / training of scorers, umpire and team manager the 12 4's season commenced. The team did not loose another game in the regular season from this point onwards!
