TEMPLETON CRICKET CLUB DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT – 2005/2006

The goal for the Templeton Cricket Club in season 2005/2006 was to ensure the club progressed on and off the field during the season. We had priorities to return the Bank account balance to a level where we could successfully run a club as well as ensure the new cricket nets met everybody's needs.

Financially, we recorded a profit of \$14657 which is a \$15440 turnaround from last season with our Bank account balances increasing to \$11542 from last season's \$709.

The highlights/ lowlights for the season were the following:

- A highly successful Super draw function that made a profit of \$7197 on the day, which is the highest ever. Thank you to Jason Disney and Brett Gibb for another fantastic effort.
- The canteen made a profit of \$3001. An excellent effort by Wendy Dewar.
- Templetonians was highly successful this season with an auction incorporated this year and made a profit of \$6793. Thanks to Jason Disney and Brett Keys for your efforts. A function will be held early next season for all Templetonians members.
- ▶ Bar takings decreased by \$681 from last season which was a disappointing result.
- Subscriptions increased this season by \$2102.

NOTES FORMING PART OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

INCOME

BAR

A decrease in income of \$681 from last season is explained by the lack of numbers on Thursday and Saturday nights. We had to increase our prices this season due to the increased cost of alcohol. We need to secure a better deal with next season's supplier.

CANTEEN

A lot of hard work by Wendy Dewar resulted in a profit of \$3001, a decrease of \$394 from last season. This is a great result considering we had no junior finals at Templeton and no senior teams played at Templeton during the finals.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

We changed the way we account for our clothing income this season by itemizing each type of apparel. The total of clothing sold was \$2761, which was an increase of \$1136 from last season, but we introduced a new cricket shirt this year.

SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

We had a number of very successful functions with attendances being mainly the same people at all events. Thanks to those who helped with the organization of our functions. The presentation night and gaming nights made good profits for the club.

AFTERNOON TEA

We made a profit of \$610 for the season, which was a \$1052 turnaround from the previous season. The addition of the afternoon tea payment to the subscriptions worked well for collection of funds and convenience for players, captains and treasurer. Thank you to Anne Tasevski for her fantastic efforts.

.=> BARBEQUE

We made a profit of only \$40 for the season compared to last season's \$665. Lack of numbers on Saturday nights reduced the sale of food. Thanks to Wendy Dewar for organizing the meat and the players for cooking each week. Thanks to Brett McIlroy for supplying the bread whenever we needed it.

FUNDRAISING

A decrease in income of \$1614 from last season with an overall profit of \$2020. The differences in income were due to the poor attendances on Thursday and Saturday nights. Joker Poker's income dropped by \$85, the Saturday raffles were down by \$490 this season and \$1032 the last two seasons. Ritchies was very similar to last season and the pre-season raffle was down \$288 from last season. The club needs to look at the attendances of its players and supporters on Thursday and Saturday nights.

SPONSORSHIP

Thank you to all of our sponsors, especially Michelle at King Club Hair & Beauty Design, HSBC Bank Australia Ltd, Luke Cosgrove at A1 Blinds and Andrew Morris.

TEMPLETONIANS

The second season this group has been introduced to the club. Coupled with an auction of sports memorabilia, Templetonians made a profit of \$6793 - an increase of \$4492 from last season. The profit of \$6793 is distorted as money has been allocated from this profit for a function early in the 2006/07 cricket season.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

A good increase in subscriptions of \$2102 from last season with most of that being in seniors.

INTEREST

A decrease in interest earned of \$519 from last season is due to the grant money we had deposited in our accounts for the majority of last season.

EXPENSES

CRICKET BALLS

Expenditure increased slightly by \$127 this season.

COACHING

This amount consists of payments to our paid players and increased by \$563 from last season but was less than our budget estimates.

EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

The purchase/renewal of equipment is an ongoing expense in running a cricket club. This amount was low due to our cricket gear purchases in the previous season.

GROUND FEES

An increase in fees of \$314 this year due to a fee increase by Knox Council.

RDCA

The costs were the same as last season. Unfortunately, our fines increased this year to \$62.

INDOOR TRAINING

An increase in expenditure of \$584 from last season due to an increase in prices and the extra use by the seniors.

CRICKET WICKET REPAIRS

The cost to remove and lay a new synthetic pitch at Milpera Reserve.

CRICKET NETS AND PITCHES

The cost to lock and secure the gates at the nets.

BAR

Expenditure increased by \$234 during the season, which was in comparison to the decrease in income.

CLUB MERCHANDISE

A large increase of \$6026 this season as we have new stock on hand of our club shirts, which we need to sell next season.

SOCIAL/FUNDRAISING

This includes payments for functions during the year. DJ's raffle prizes and all other expenses incurred in presenting functions for the players.

CLEANING

A decrease of \$287 this season thanks to Paul and Judy Denton for their efforts on a weekly basis. The clubrooms displayed a professional image to our members and visitors at all times.

TELEPHONE

A decrease in expenditure of \$367 from last season as the internet costs are now itemized separately.

INSURANCE

A decrease of \$43 this season.

CONSUMER AND BUSINESS AFFAIRS

A decrease of \$101 as last season we registered a new business name.

TROPHIES

A decrease of \$562 from last season due to the lack of any premierships in seniors and juniors.

BANK CHARGES

The credit card merchant facility accrued charges of \$858 from credit card spending of \$19,965 up \$6,464 from last season. There were 129 credit card transactions at an average of \$155 per transaction. Unfortunately, the \$4 fee will need to increase to cover the costs. The abolition of the Government debits tax saved us \$118.

INTERNET

These are the costs for having the Internet from Telstra.

WEBSITE

The cost of the maintenance of the website was decreased by \$355 this season.

I would like to thank Brett Keys and the committee for providing me with the opportunity to continue in the role of coach at the Templeton Cricket Club and for their ongoing support during the year.

To assist with the development of the playing group I was ably assisted by Travis Degenhardt who was responsible for the bowling and Luke Robertson who worked with the batsmen. Along with the new training facilities this provided the club with a solid coaching base with ample opportunities for the players to develop and improve their cricketing skills.

The 2005/2006 season proved to be a challenging one with only two teams playing consistent cricket to record a top four finish in their respective grades. During the year over 100 players represented the Templeton Cricket Club with the following four players to be congratulated on their achievements:

- Luke Robertson RDCA All Star Team and 20/20 RDCA team v Ringwood
- Jason Disney 20/20 RDCA team v Ringwood
- Andrew Gottliebsen RDCA representative team

A Player Development program was presented to players to assist in furthering their playing and training performances. This required the players to analyse their performances and set personal goals in all aspects of their play. The "B Train" driven by Brett Keys played an exciting final series which saw them overcome some more fancied opponents. They bowled and fielded with enthusiasm over their three games, only to fall short against an experienced Norwood in the grand final.

Graham Brookman's fifth eleven battled hard throughout the season providing many opportunities for a group of experienced and younger players, while Steve Tasevski successfully guided the G Grade team into a preliminary final with a 70's one day cricket theme proving successful at St. Andrews.

I look forward to the upcoming season with great enthusiasm – the challenge for us all is in the area of performing at a consistent level over a full day's cricket.

To Hayden Surrao, I take my hat off to you again. Coaching the under 12's would be one of the hardest jobs but you seem to get better at it each year. The development of these young kids is really coming along and there will be some future stars at Templeton to come from this bunch. Your focus on developing these kids' techniques rather than just trying to win every game will put Templeton in great shape for the future.

Matt Fisher has shown great maturity this season by taking on responsibility of the Under 14's and the Milo Program. His work with the under 14's was exceptional with such a young side. Matt really got this side to bond and play for each other, and for a side which many thought would struggle, they just missed the finals. There is no doubt that if the under 14's were to sneak in; they would have given the sides in there a run for their money.

To all the parents who helped out during the year with umpiring and scoring thank you very much. I'd like to especially thank Phil & Wendy Dewar for all of their help, both of your help this year has been enormous and I am very grateful for that.

This is my last season in the role of Junior Operations Manager for Templeton. I would like to thank both Dean Morrison and Brett Keys for giving me the opportunity to take on this role. Whilst I have not achieved everything I would have liked to I believe it is time for change with the juniors, and I'm sure the processes are in place to grow to one of the biggest junior clubs again.

If I have one last message for 2006/07 is for those who have taken a lot to put something back into OUR CLUB and OUR FUTURE. Remember, everybody has to start somewhere.
