PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our season commenced at the A.G.M. in June, and from that date until Christmas your Committee met every two weeks.

I commenced my report with that statement as it highlights the commitment necessary to ensure success on and off the field.

Our objectives were simple, yet not easily achievable, they were as follows:

1. To Bring the Junior side of the Club into the main body and create an environment of fun and learning. This objective I believe was achieved, two premierships, one runner-up and one just missing the finals by less than one per cent.
2. Ensure the Seniors avoided relegation by the 1st XI finishing in the top five. Achieved the Firsts finished 3rd.
3. Attain a degree of financial stability. At the time of writing this report we required a super successful Presentation Night and Pokies Trip to ensure this objective is achieved.

Our approach this year was to run the Club like a business with regular financial monitoring and continuous communication with playing personnel. To that end we succeeded.

Overall Season 93/94 was the most successful on field since the club's creation. We fielded eleven teams (7 senior and 4 junior), gained two premierships and had ten out of the eleven in finals. To all who contributed, thank you and very well done.

It would be remiss of me if I did not mention the absolutely outstanding efforts of YOUR committee men. Each approached their tasks with enthusiasm, professionalism and dedication to YOUR Club.

It would be equally remiss of me if I did not mention the attitude of some players who treat YOUR rooms like a pig sty and the club in general with disrespect. These people are in the minority and know who they are, next season fella's how about lifting your game.

Our ground has required maintenance for years and after the finals we entered into a self-help programme with the Council and footy club to install just on 1,000 metres of drainage. This was an enormous task, to the few who assisted many thanks. One disappointing note here is that our 1st and 2nd elevens use this ground exclusively all season, and during the work we had one 1st XI and one 2nd XI player assist. This sums up the attitude of those who take all and give nothing in return.

Overall our season was a tremendous success, except for the downsides previously mentioned. For our Club to prosper and grow we require commitment from all not just a few.

Season 1994/95 will create greater pressure for us as all sides will compete in a superior standard of cricket. The focus we must have next year should be an extension of this year but with more dedication and commitment to Templeton Cricket Club to enable us to build on the foundation laid in 93/94.

I look forward to seeing you all again next season.

TREASURERS REPORT

At the conclusion of the 1993/94 financial year the Club finished up a little ahead of the start of the year.

Although it is always good in these times to break even and even better if you can finish up better than you started the Committee had aimed for a better result.

At the beginning of the year the committee accepted a budget which gave each area of income and expenditure a goal to work around. Unfortunately the budget was not met for a number of reasons:

- . a couple of social events did not proceed due to lack of interest and other reasons.
- . greater than expected outlays due to fielding six senior sides.
- . greater than expected outlays due to ten sides out of the eleven making the finals (no one's complaining though!)
- . the loss of over \$1300.00 due to cowardly thefts through the season.
- . the loss of around ten players who decided that they did not want to pay subscriptions and left the Club.

Nevertheless the budget did have the effect of focusing committee members attention on the financial management of the Club and in particular to each members sphere of responsibility as it pertained to the effect on the Club's finances.

Many thanks must go to Larry Johnston (bar manager) and Nathan Small (food, raffles, social events and general fund raising) for the great contribution to the financial side of the Club.

In the front of this report you will see a list of the Club's sponsors who either donated cash or goods to be sold or raffled or both. Without them the Club could not continue with subscriptions at the low level they are.

During the year the Committee endeavoured to stick to the Club's policy that all subscriptions should be paid by the end of October. However, as is always the case players left it until the last minute to make arrangements or had to be coerced into paying. The result of following this policy was that, as mentioned previously, the Club lost ten senior players and \$1300 in subscriptions.

A request therefore to all players - please pay your subscriptions as early as possible to not only assist the Club but to take advantage of the generous discounts offered for early payment.

To administer a Club the size of Templeton is not easy when you consider that total turnover is around \$80,000.00. And it is not getting any easier.

It is imperative that any social functions and fund raising activities which are organised are well attended to help the Club's bank balance and to allow subscriptions to be kept as low as possible.

Finally, I would like to congratulate Murray and the rest of the Committee on a job well done and for their efforts in trying to meet the budget. With the experience behind us, and your support, the job started in 1993/94 will continue and improve in 1994/95.

The Senior Club Champion will be a player from the Clubs first eleven who has achieved the most points during the season.

The Junior Club Champion will be the player who has achieved the most points during the season.

Calculations for both Club Champions will be based on the following points allocation :-

UNDER 14/3 REPORT

Paul Drew, last man in, joined Simon McClure and put his head down and played straight, together they put on 37 runs for the 10th wicket to allow us to reach 157, a respectable score.

Then it came our turn to bowl, once again I was getting a little worried as wickets weren't falling quickly enough. I have to say though that our fielding was brilliant and really made it hard for East Ringwood to get amongst the runs.

It was Chris Murray who decided to change the game. He came on to bowl and really let himself go taking 4/9 allowing Templeton to dismiss East Ringwood for 99 - and bring the flag home to Templeton...

It would be remiss of me if I did not mention a few of the boys.

First, Mark Wadsworth - Mark was asked to takeover as Captain half way through the season. His efforts as Captain was fantastic, he did not let the weight of responsibility affect his own performances taking 29 wickets at an average of 5.79. These figures earning him not only the Club's bowling average but also the RDCA bowling award.

Secondly, Adrian Crough - another boy who performed remarkably well with the bat and ball during the season making 333 runs at an average of 55.50 and taking 15 wickets at an average of 9.73.

He was successful at winning the batting average and the Junior Club Champion awards for Templeton and the RDCA batting award.

Paul Drew - the winner of the coaches award. This award could have gone to any of the boys - it was a very hard decision. This award isn't one which relies on averages or performances, it is awarded to a player who displays team spirit, and does what is asked of him without any show of dissent etc - Paul always showed these qualities.

To the players I haven't mentioned, you are just as important - without you all we would not have had such a wonderful season - you can all be very proud of your efforts, just as I am.

Now to the parents - what a great bunch you are. Always there, always prepared to help, support and transport. You, as much as anyone made this a season to remember.

Special thanks to Barry Wadsworth who scored all year. It's great to know that the score book will always be 100% correct.

Bruce Tolliday, John Drew, Terry Shanley, Graham Powell and others who always helped automatically without being asked - thank you.

Finally I would like to express my, and the boys, thanks to Dean Morrison, not only for a great job as Junior Administrator but also for the work he did with the U14/3's - Thanks Deano.

To the U16's and both U12 teams and all trophy winners congratulations for a great season.
